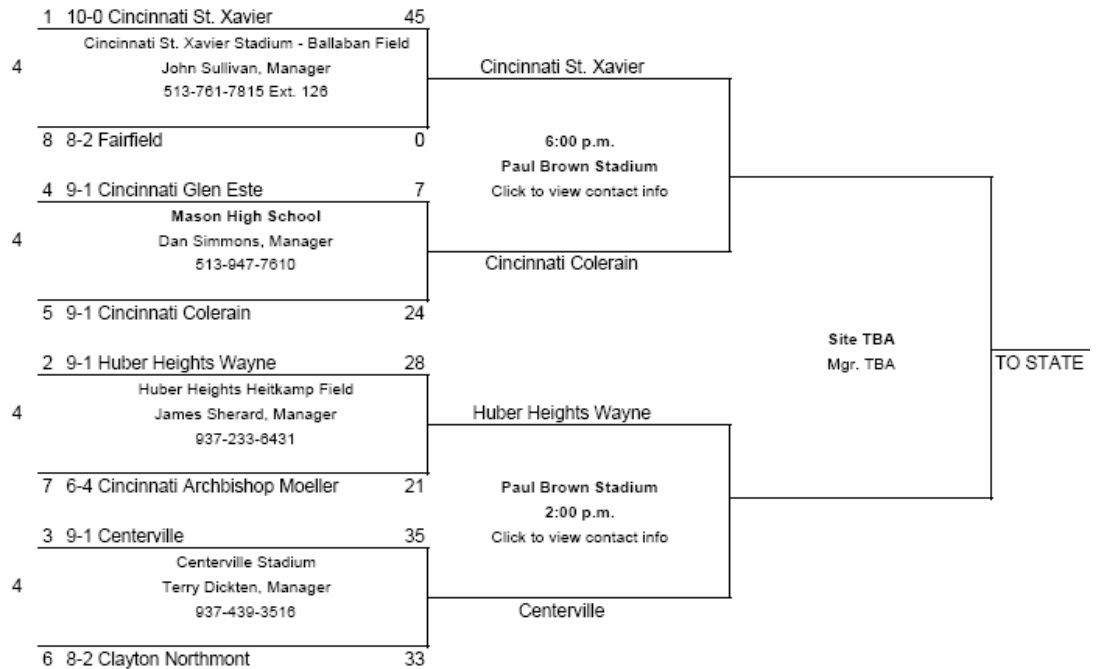

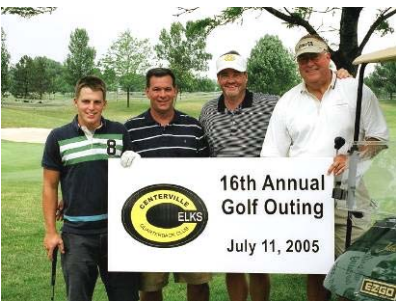
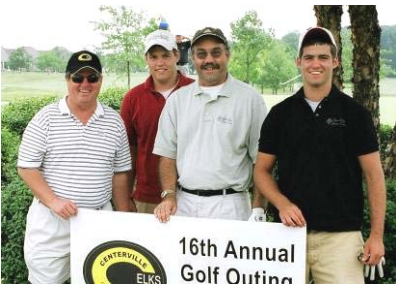


2005 GOLF OUTING

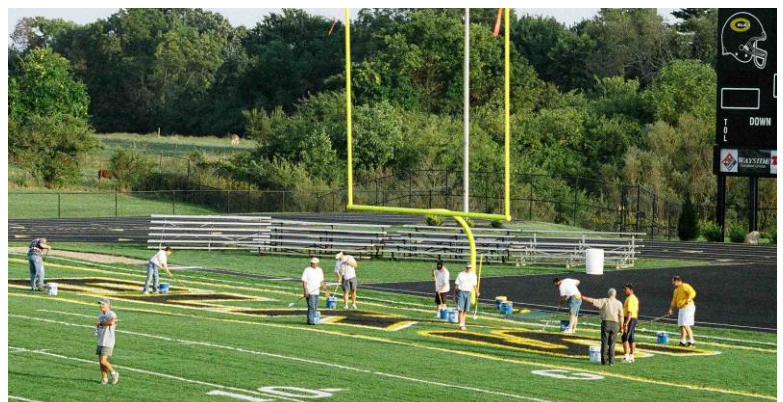
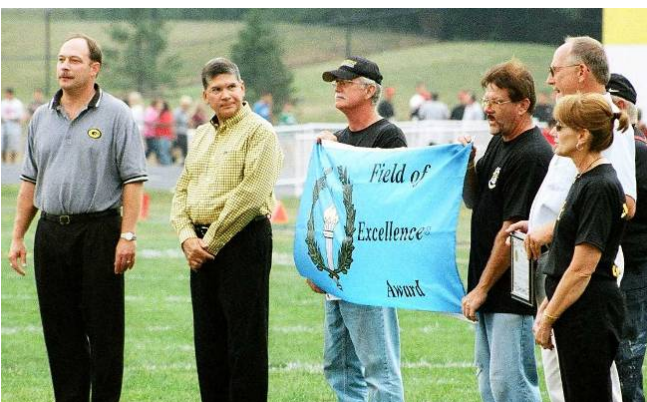
