## Thanks 2006 Seniors

Coach Ullery said that the expectations for the 2006 season were unknown in that we were changing our defense as well as significant personnel shifts and coaching shifts. He indicated that three of the four first games were against teams that were in the playoffs the year before, and didn't expect Fairfield and Princeton to finish as poorly as they did. In regards to the Northmont game, it was our first loss after beating both Princeton and Fairfield and as he said, it was unfortunate in that the offense, the defense, nor the specialty teams did very well that game.

Coach Ullery then recalled that we then faced Don Bosco Prep, from New Jersey, in the Kirk Herbstreit Classic. He indicated that it was a privilege to play that caliber of team and that they ultimately wound up being the New Jersey State Champions. However, in that game, he indicated we did not have a "full deck of cards" to play with.

Following those two defeats, it was a test for the seniors and he indicated that the following six games showed the "real team" that Centerville had with six convincing victories. He said he would have liked to have seen this team tested in the playoffs; however, in that it didn't work out that way; we were still GWOC champions and we had that trophy, not Wayne.

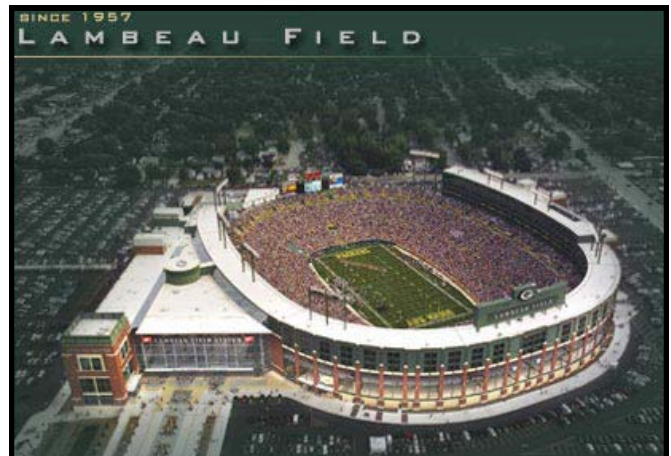
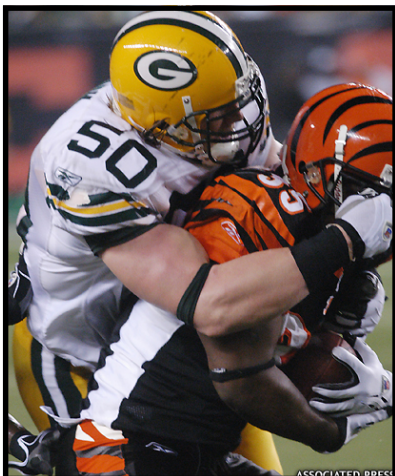
## Attend this year's Golf Outing / Silent Auction and you could be watching A.J. Hawk in historic Lambeau Field again this fall.

Each year the Centerville Quarterback Club gives the Quarterback Club Scholarship to a senior who has excelled off the field as well as on the field. Leadership, hard work, performance in the classroom, involvement in the community, commitment to ethical and moral behavior, and character are some of the attributes considered in the selection process. This award attempts to recognize a successful athlete who has demonstrated personal growth and achievement as a whole person.

This year's award-winner for a \$2,000 scholarship was Calvin Moran. Calvin has over a 3.4 grade average and is interested in pursuing an education in the field of engineering at Miami University. His extra-curricular activities included Young Life, his youth group at South Brook Christian Church, and Habitat for Humanity.

In 2004, he was a part of the GWOC conference championship team that was undefeated, and lettered that year. In 2005, he received the Iron Man award and the Elk Iron award for off-season weightlifting. His senior year, he was named a Captain, won the Elk Iron award for off-season lifting, and was also first team all-greater Western Ohio conference.

Calvin indicated in his essay that the qualities that he learned from playing Centerville Football were hard work, unselfishness, and mental toughness. He reinforced that the idea that attitude and effort were all that we could control left a permanent impression in his mind.

Calvin is a fine young man and clearly an example of the type of player that the Quarterback Club would like to recognize annually with this scholarship.

## Top Honors Awarded at Banquet

Each year, there are several top awards that are given to outstanding players for that year's team. This year, the most valuable offensive player award was given to Senior running back Will Johnson and the most value defensive player award went to Senior linebacker Tyler Replogle.

In addition, the players vote for the most improved players on offense and defense. The winners this year were junior quarterback David Flemming on offense and junior linebacker Tyler Williams on defense.

In addition, Coach Ullery gives four awards to four seniors that he feels epitomize the Centerville football program. This year's team award winners were Calvin Moran, Matt Burtenshaw, Blake Engholm, and Jake Sillaman.

# Senior Banquet

Lynne Davis opened this year's banquet as Co-President of the Centerville Football Mother's Club, welcoming all of the parents and the players. She then turned the program over to Coach Ullery for his summary of the season.

Coach Ullery acknowledged the many people that contribute to the success of the program through their efforts including the Mother's Club, the Quarterback Club, Mike Shrek and Barry Burtenshaw, press box volunteers, including Bill Wilson, who was in attendance, the band, cheerleaders, administration, principals, trainers and coaches.

Coach Ullery then introduced each of the position coaches to talk about each of their senior players. He indicated that this was a banquet to honor the Seniors, and other than the award each player would get, comments would only be made about Seniors.

Coach Pat Roncagli, who coaches the defensive line, indicated that there were no returning lettermen from last year on this year's defensive line. He said the seniors did everything right in the off season, and paid a price to earn the right to play this year. He said that the senior class gave a gift of example, of sacrifice, and a love of football to the underclassmen.

He introduced **Avery Johnson**, and indicated that he worked extremely hard off season, a great support player and would do anything to help the team, although he did not get to play a lot on Friday nights.

**Cory Butterfield**, he said, was a very versatile player, playing defensive line, linebacker, and defensive end. He also had a great work ethic. He was also said to have a "heart" as big as this room.

**Alex Carlson** was the next defensive lineman and was the most experienced of the seniors, as well as the most expressive. He was identified by Coach Roncagli as a "leader by example," and that he is the type of person that "loves life", always with a smile on his face.

He next then talked about **Blake Engholm**, who he said was the smallest starter on the defensive line and was usually playing against one of the other team's best offensive lineman. Coach Roncagli indicated that he earned the respect of his coaches, as well as the coaches in the league, which was evidence by his All League selection.

The linebacker coach was Coach Keith Bertram. He simply indicated that this year's group of linebackers were "a blessing to him". He first introduced **Chris Leisring**, who he said had an intuitive sense and could find the ball, but was unfortunately behind three All League linebackers. Chris's role was to be available to fill in, and he did that very well. He started in the Xenia game and performed very well in that game. He finished the season with 38 tackles; seventh best on the team, and he did it while primarily being on the specialty teams.

The coach then introduced **Matt Burtenshaw**, who he said personifies toughness. He said Matt had a serious shoulder injury his junior year and it continued to plague him throughout his senior year. He said he was one of the hardest hitters on the team. He was enormously quick and he had a couple of key plays, both in Don Bosco game as well as an interception at Fairmont. Matt finished the year as second team All League.

The next linebacker was **Tyler Replogle**. He said Tyler's most exciting day of the year was the first day that he gets to hit someone. He said he is the most competitive player he has ever coached. He relentlessly pursues the offence from sideline to sideline and had numerous touchdown saving tackles. He indicated that Tyler was an obvious choice for captain and served as a great example. Tyler had a total of 70 individual tackles and 63 assists for a total of 133 tackles, leading the team. He also had 8 quarterback sacks and 3 knockdown passes.

## *Senior Banquet (continued)*

Coach Greg Bell then introduced the safeties. He first introduced the kicker, **Colin Jones**. He said that Colin was great to work with. He said, like all kickers, he has his nuances. However, he worked harder than any other kicker that they have ever had. He said he has an enormously strong leg, but his best attribute was his diversity, his ability to kick both the on-side and the "pooch" kick.

Coach Bell then talked about the safeties as a group. He indicated that they had a huge challenge to overcome, in that this year was an entirely new defense and all of the three safeties had changed positions from their prior year.

He first introduced **Matt Miller**, who was a second year letterman, and who he indicated had a great work ethic. He said that Matt's leadership in the off-season was excellent and few knew that Matt played with a shoulder injury the entire year. Coach Bell also indicated that Matt was second on the team in tackles with 95 total tackles, and it was apparent that Matt would rise to the occasion in that his best games were Northmont and Wayne. He indicated he was enormously versatile and played on all specialty teams and was able to run a touchdown on a punt return. He indicated that Matt peaked in his ability at the right time and that he would meet any challenges that were put in front of him. He also indicated that his biggest hit will long be remembered on an offside kick in the Northmont game which he had a substantial blow to the person receiving the ball.

He then introduced **John McConnaughey** as a very, very hard worker. He said he also made great strides off season and this year he had 62 tackles with 11 of those tackles being behind the line of scrimmage. His best games were Northmont, Wayne, and Xenia. He indicated that John's best play was perhaps, ironically, the bad call in the Northmont game in which he caused a fumble, however, the play was incorrectly called as an incomplete pass.

The third safety was **Greg O'Dell** who received his third year varsity award. He, as well, changed positions this year moving from outside linebacker to safety. He was also on the specialty teams and was player of the week three times on the specialty teams. He had over 100 tackles as a junior and finished this year with 45 tackles.

The next coach to introduce his seniors was offensive line coach, George Reinke. Coach Reinke first made special acknowledgement to Coach Doug Peck and Coach Adam Ciarlariello for their contributions to the offensive line and their work with him.

First was **Taylor Bir**. Taylor was known as "Bir Dog". He was the biggest kid on the team and made a great contribution on the scout team. He further said that Taylor always had a smile on his face.

Coach Reinke then introduced **Jeremy Blanford**, who received his second year varsity award. Jeremy began the season as guard and then changed positions and started as center for most of the year. He played through many injuries and perhaps one of the most distinguishing things of Jeremy's season was that as a center, there were no missed snaps.

Coach Reinke then introduced **Drew Davis**. Drew was selected as first team GWOC as well as first team Southwestern Ohio. His season started out at tight end; however, after it was apparent that he was not going to be receiving many passes, he was moved back to tackle. He typically went against the best defensive player on the other team and always did very well. Drew is expected to play somewhere in college next year.

Hye-Seung Kim was the next senior, and although Hye-Seung missed a year or two, he came back as a senior and proved to be a great support and contributed wherever the team needed him.

The next senior was **Nate "Skates" Hall** who received his first varsity letter this year. He worked primarily on the scout team and provided a great amount of leadership as a senior on the offensive scout team.

**T.J.Hall** received his third varsity award and started the season at center but wound up playing as guard. Coach Reinke indicated that he is known as a "quiet leader".

The next senior to be introduced on the offensive line was **John Kordalis** who was receiving his first year varsity award. John was changed from defense to offense this year and worked extremely hard. However, the coach indicated there was just too much experience ahead of him for him to get a lot of playing time. Nevertheless, John was unselfish and didn't complain, accepting his role as a support on the team this year.

**Calvin Moran** was then introduced as a third-year letterman. Coach Reinke indicated that Calvin was named as a captain this year, which is not typical for an offensive lineman. However, Calvin was very well regarded and a very hard worker. Calvin received the second team on the offensive line in Southwestern Ohio and was first team GWOC.

The next coach to introduce his players was the quarterback coach Dave Miller. He had only one senior and he couldn't say enough about **Grant Mink**. This was Grant's second year varsity letter and although he only started three games in those two years, he was always available as a back-up. He indicated that Grant was very consistent and constantly available, even though he knew he would only be playing the role of a back-up. He indicated that for most players, it would be very difficult to do what he did with the level of talent and skill that he had. However, he was very strong in accepting his role and deserved to be recognized for the character and hard work that he displayed for the benefit of the team.

Coach Matt Mitchell then introduced the senior running backs. **Jake Sillaman** was the first to be introduced. He indicated that he was the best blocking back that we had this year and after a few years of looking for a home, he found his place in the offensive back field. In the off season, he worked enormously hard to improve his speed by .3 of a second in the 40 yard dash, which is very, very difficult. Coach Mitchell indicated that Jake had an enormously positive attitude and contributed a great amount of effort.

**Will Johnson** was then introduced to Couch Matt Mitchell. He indicated that Will was an exceptional athlete with 9.3 yards per carry. Coach Mitchell indicated that Will was extremely committed as he came out his junior year and practice the entire year with no assurance that he would get an opportunity to play any games that year at all. Only after last years team made the play offs did Will get an opportunity to play in two games. Coach Mitchell indicated that Will was a "warrior". He had great athleticism, was smart and had played four different positions for the team this year. He also indicated that Will would likely be a division one scholarship recipient to play football next year.

The next coach Adam Ciarlariello then introduced his players, the wide receivers. He said that the wide receiver title was often substituted with "perimeter blockers". He said before he introduced the boys, he would like to acknowledge all of the seniors and their families, as well as the coaches for their contribution to him enjoying coaching such a great group of boys. He indicated that most of his players would all have liked to have another year of eligibility.

He indicated that **Esteban Cartin-Jimenez** had a great personality, worked extremely hard and was perhaps the most improved wide receiver. He said that Esteban has a great ability to work well with the youth, as he did in the youth camp.

Another wide receiver was **Daivy Bizimana**, who showed great leadership within the wide receiver group. He also made great improvements this year in his blocking, and had great speed.

**Tim Cochran** was the next senior wide receiver that he introduced and he indicated that it was his first year since the 8th grade that he played football, and that he wished he had another year to play. He indicated that he was very coach able, intelligent and athletic.

The next person that was introduced was **PJ Powell**, who was receiving his third varsity letter. However, it was actually his fourth year playing varsity in that he was moved up to varsity his freshman year as a place kicker. The coach indicated that when it was apparent that he was not going to be the place kicker due to other younger players coming up, PJ took on punting and worked extremely hard on it and has become the leading punter in the entire area in high school football. PJ has already indicated that he will be going into the Marines following his graduation from high school.

Follow the player introductions, Denny Hayes, the co-head trainer, introduced Beth Carstens, the other co-head trainer. He first congratulated the team this year on not having "stinky feet." He then went on to say how pleased and proud he was of this years trainers. He indicated that all three seniors, **Emma Young, Amanda Zuurdeeg, and Kaitlin Fisher** plan to major in athletic training in college.

He then introduced the other trainers **Kensie Everhart, Alex Niebeling, and Ashley Duibley**.

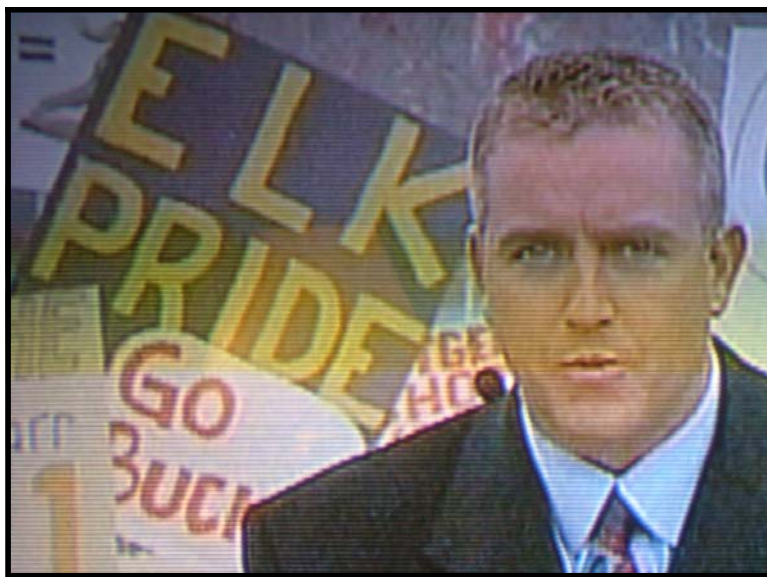
