The Centerville Elks football team fell to the Dublin Coffman Rocks, 22-14, in Dublin - but not before making it interesting in the second half. This game was a real back-and-forth battle that came down to the last minutes of the game.

Braylon "The Cat" Newcomb, took the direct snap, and raced 33 yards to put the Elks ahead 14-13, with 7 minutes left in the fourth quarter. The Rocks then went on a 6 play, 85 yard drive that ended with seven points to take the lead for good. With five minutes left to play the Elks had their opportunities, however two tough calls that did not go Centerville's way, and the third Elk turnover of the night sealed the first loss of the season.

Statistically speaking, both teams were close, and identical in a number of categories, such as punts, redzone touchdowns, and first downs. Five Dublin Coffman drives started in Centerville territory, with two the result of turnovers. The Elks defense rose to the challenge and held the Rocks to two field goals as a result of both short field turnovers. Turnovers can be game changers. The turnover margin is the ratio of turnovers conceded by a team to the number of turnovers that team generates in a given game or season. As we all know, turnover margin is crucial to winning football games. Centerville's turnover margin was -3 last Friday night.

The team will learn from, grow from, and put this setback behind them. Next up are the Tigers from Pickerington Central. This is the second team from the Columbus area the Elks will face, and they are ranked number two in the Columbus Dispatch Power 7, (page 8). They have made the OHSAA playoffs 23 times, including 17 years in a row. They have won the state tournament twice, first in 2017 and then again in 2019. Be sure to check out the Pickerington preview on pages 6-10. The Tigers are favored by 7 points, and Elk Nation needs to turn out to be that "12th man" to help your Elks upset the Tigers.

This Friday is teacher appreciation night. This tradition gives the student-athlete the opportunity to honor a teacher who has made a memorable impact on their life. What they do in the classroom goes beyond teaching the curriculum, and tests; they teach lessons that their students take with them for the rest of their lives.

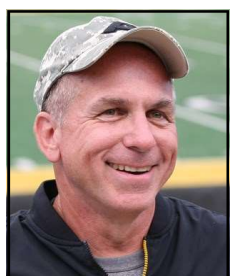

Looking back on your first year as a head coach to this point, are there any lessons learned or anything you changed to develop your own system?

Of course! I've learned a ton! I'm not sure I could list off everything I've learned that has helped me create my "system" but I know that I live by something that Coach Tressel taught us at Ohio State. It's not about the coach. It's not about the plays. **IT'S ALL ABOUT THE PEOPLE. YOU WIN WITH PEOPLE.** I learned that my job is much less weighted on what plays we call or what practice schedule we follow. It's about finding the right people for the job, and letting them do their job. My job is to provide opportunities and resources. That's it. A head coach of mine, Rodney Roberts, put it best when he said "Hunting is a lot easier if you find yourself a great hunting dog." In my opinion, that's my main job. To find the right people and put them in the right situations to grow and affect our program. I realize that publicly I get some of the credit when things go well, but everyone needs to understand that it is the assistant coaches, players, feeder programs, and support staff around our program that are doing the real work and deserve the real credit. They are the talented ones. I can assure you of that.

Over the last twenty-five years, the program has developed players to the professional and college level. What goes into developing these athletes to play beyond high school?

The answer to this question is in the answer to the previous question. Great players attracted to and developed from great people around them. The real great ones will all say that. When you have the right people around the players, you're going to see great development.

Pickerington Central comes into Centerville Stadium, undefeated, and ranked in the top ten in Ohio state polls. What is the preparation mindset when you face a tough team like the Tigers?

Pick Central is a great team and has been for many many years. Their ranking is not surprising or undeserved. I'd like to believe that our preparation for a great team is exactly the same as our preparation for any other team. If you saw practice this week, you'd see exactly the same expectations, effort, and attitude that you'd see any other week. Our team is focused on being better today than we were yesterday. The real competition is ourselves and who we were yesterday and on Friday nights we get to faceoff against great teams to find out if we are getting better.

Justin Terry, Senior offensive lineman from Pickerington Central has committed to West Virginia. Who are some of their other top players?

Having high-profile players is not something that is new for Pick Central. Having high-profile players is not something that is new for us either. Additionally, facing off against high-profile players is not new for our program. We do it almost every week of our season and into our post-season. Iron sharpens iron and we couldn't be more excited to go out and compete against a great team. Keep an eye out for some incredible skill players on their team. They have a few nice running backs, a talented QB, and some really nice wide receivers to go with a big and strong offensive line. And the best part is that a lot of them play both ways! Pick Central is doing it right with two-way players and multi-sport athletes. I know we've talked about that before and probably will in the future so I won't go off on too much of a tangent. They are a great team and Friday night is going to be an awesome test. We are incredibly grateful.

Centerville rallies late but big plays sink Elks vs. Coffman

Elks fall to 1-1 with game against Pickerington Central in Week 3.

DUBLIN — Centerville coaches and players faced a long walk from the turf at Coffman Stadium to the locker room at the high school. Dublin Coffman knew the feeling, having experienced something similar, albeit during a shorter walk at Centerville High School, in a 48-14 loss to the Elks in 2022.

Coffman avenged that defeat with a 22-14 victory against Centerville on Friday in the second week of the high school football season.

"We need to be better," Centerville coach Brent Ullery said. "Certain parts of our games need to be better."

In a matchup of 1-0 teams, the Elks took their first and only lead of the game on a 33-yard touchdown run by Braylon Newcomb with 7:56 left in the game.

"He's an older player," Ullery said. "We have a lot of players that are really great and made a lot of really nice plays out there. When it came down to it, they made more plays. They had a great game plan. They came after us, and they were the better team tonight."

Coffman answered on its next possession. Quinn Hart, who completed 14 of 20 passes for 142 yards while running for 132 yards on 18 carries, threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Eli Losey with 5:22 to play. After the conversion run failed, Coffman had a 19-14 lead.

Centerville's next drive ended when Drake Wells threw his second interception of the game. It was Centerville's third turnover. Coffman did not turn the ball over.

"Three to zero," Ullery said. "You're not going to win too many games doing that."

Coffman capitalized when Matthew Schramm kicked a 46-yard field goal, his third of the game, with 3:30 to play. Centerville got the ball back but was forced to punt. Coffman then ran out the clock.

Coffman led Centerville 10-7 at halftime, taking the lead on a 39-yard field goal by Schramm on the final play of the half.

Earlier in the half, a promising first drive by Centerville ended with an interception in Dublin territory. Neither team scored in the first quarter.

Hart got Coffman team on the board with a 36-yard touchdown run with 6:45 left in the half.

Centerville tied the game on the next possession. Wells scrambled to buy time and

found Newcomb in the end zone for a 10-yard touchdown.

Wells completed 17 of 26 passes for 143 yards after completing 16 of 22 passes for 180 yards in a season-opening 30-12 victory against Lakota East.

Newcomb rushed seven times for 58 yards and caught five passes for 40 yards. He scored two touchdowns for the second straight week.

Centerville plays another Columbus-area team in Week 3. Pickerington Central (2-0) comes to Centerville after beating Wayne 25-20 on Friday in Pickerington.

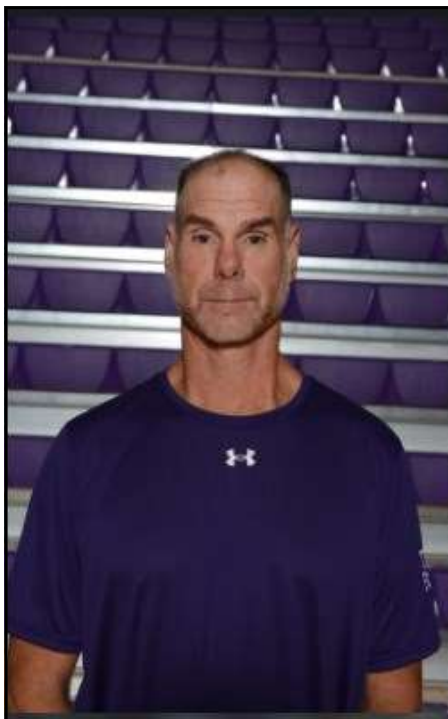

The top portion of the Super 7 high school football poll remains stable, but the bottom continues to fluctuate.

A week after three new teams entered the rankings, taking the final three spots, two new teams have grabbed the last two spots.

Dublin Coffman and Hilliard Bradley have moved into the poll for the first time this season, with Hartley and Marysville dropping out following Week 2 losses.

Gahanna Lincoln has been atop the Super 7 since the preseason, and the Lions are back to being a unanimous No. 1 after missing out on one first-place vote last week.

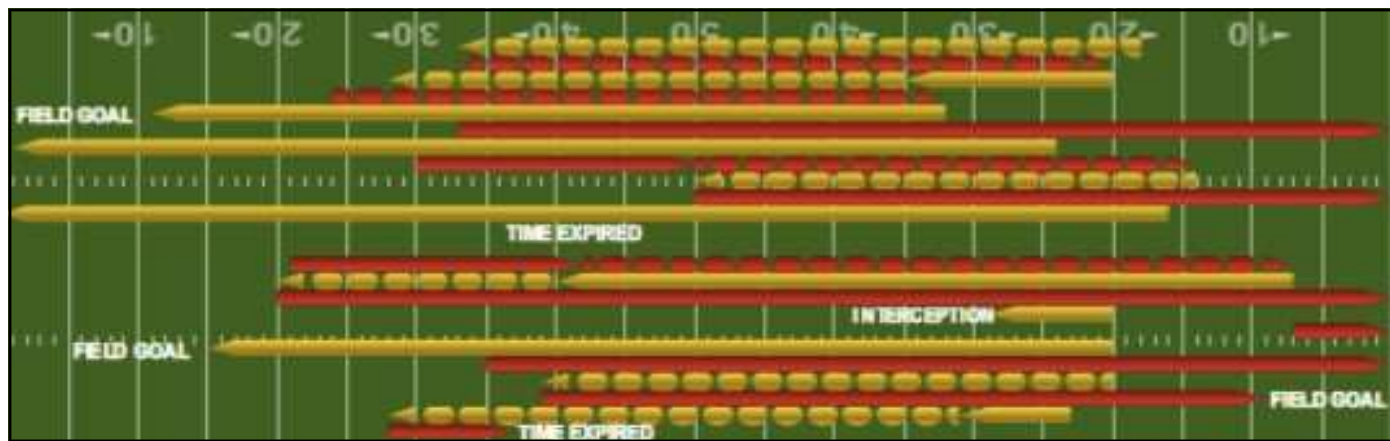
