The Centerville Elks open their **75th** football season this Friday night. The **754th** game will be played at Centerville stadium. The Lakota East Thunderhawks are coming off a disappointing 3-7 season last year, and just missed the playoffs as the 17th team in region 4, (The Elks were the 3rd seed in Region 2) of the 2022 OHSAA playoffs.

Twenty-eight returning letter-winners provide strong experience and depth for the Elks. Brent Ullery enters his seventh season as the Head Coach and is optimistic for another successful campaign. The players have worked extremely hard during the off season, preparing themselves physically for the challenge of Centerville football.

Multi-sport athletes (pictured above) are a critical success factor for a competitive team. Coach Ullery is a big supporter, "We strongly encourage our football players to play other sports. Even if football is their "primary" sport, we tell them that there is no substitute for competing. This year, we have over 56% of our team playing other sports throughout the year." College coaches agree that the most competitive college athletes were those that played at least two sports in high school. Coach Ullery continues, "It teaches them out to be better athletes, budget their time, keep their grades up, and be a flat-out competitor on and off the field. Kids have a short window to play sports and to grow into great young adults. Being a multi-sport athlete definitely provides those opportunities."

The Elks return six players who were recognized last year by their competitive coaches as they won GWOC honors. Ross Coppick, DB, Mason Keely, DE, and Reggie Powers III, DB, represented the Elks on the defensive GWOC teams. Bryce Cowgill, TE, Jamar Montgomery, WR, and Braylon Newcomb, WR/QB, were spotlighted by the coaches on the offensive GWOC teams. Head Coach Brent Ullery was also selected as 2022 Coach of the Year.

Lakota East will have a new head football coach leading the Thunderhawks in 2023. Former Cincinnati Bengal quarterback Jon Kitna was announced as the head man in February. He has been a head coach for ten years with a 68-42 record. He also brings his son, junior Jamison Kitna, to play quarterback. Jamison is a big time talent that transferred from Burluson, Texas. He threw for 2,600 yards, ran for 405 yards with 26 touchdowns passing and seven scores on the ground as a sophomore. He has a dream to play at the next level and currently has multiple offers including, Baylor, Duke, **Houston**, Texas Tech, and West Virginia.

What have you learned about your team this summer that kind of stands out to you, one of those things that's going to make this team special this year?

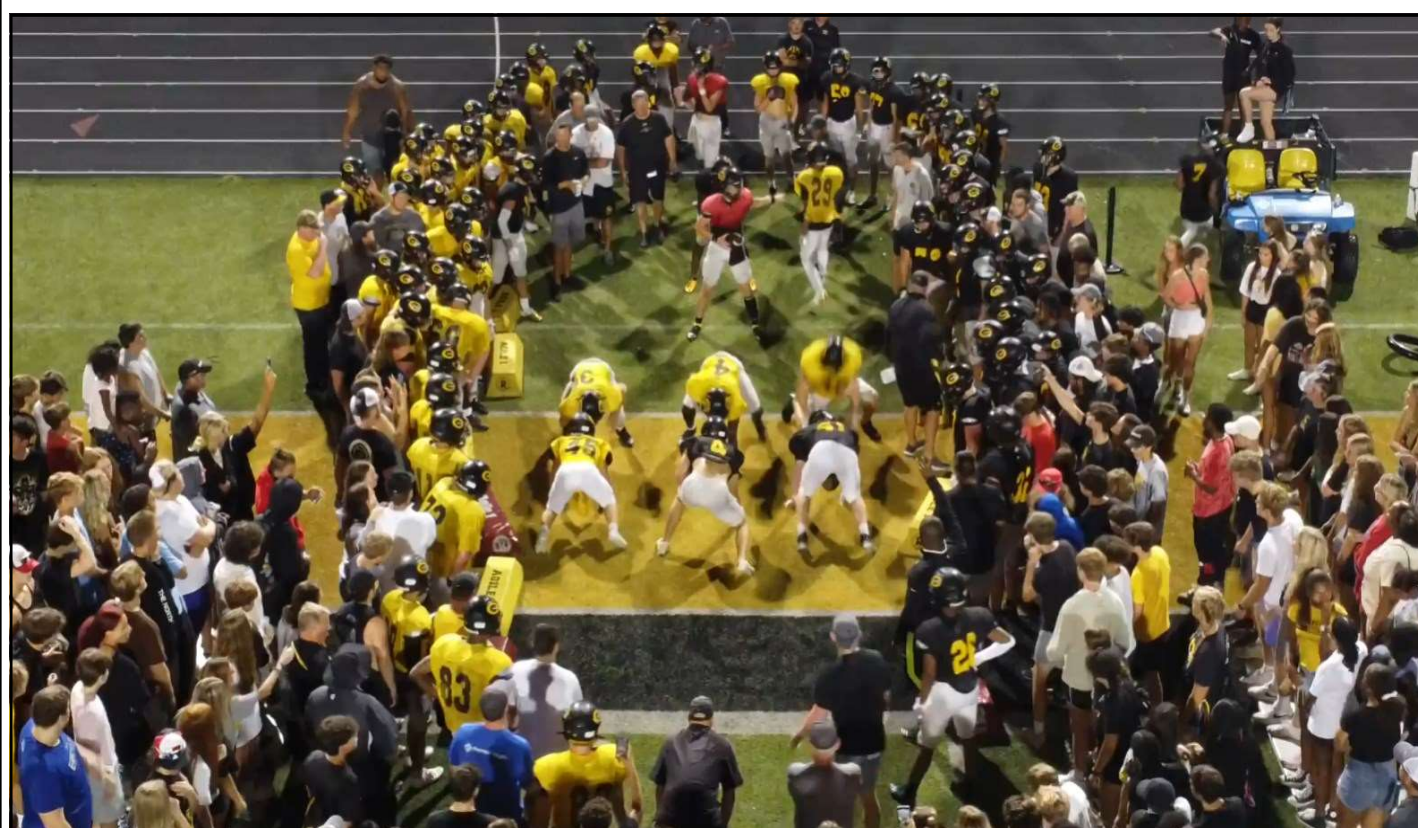
You have added two new coaches on your staff this season, can you tell us a little about them and their position responsibility?

Back in late February Lakota East decided to take its football program in a whole new direction hiring former Cincinnati Bengals quarterback Jon Kitna as its new head coach. The Thunderhawks finished 3-7 a year ago and were one of just three Region 4 teams that didn't make the playoffs. With an injection of energy and confidence from Kitna, East believes it can right this ship, sooner rather than later.

Division I, Region 4

TOP RETURNERS

Nick Fritzsche, Sr, OL – The leader of the offensive line. The 6-foot-4, 290-pound Fritzsche has offers from Ohio Dominican and Wilmington.

Cohen Reip, Jr, LB – The anchor of the middle of the Thunderhawks defense who has a tremendous upside. Reip recorded 28 total tackles, had a sack and three-and-a-half tackles for losses in his varsity debut.

Andy Vogelmann, Sr, WR – Will be one of the biggest benefactors of Kitna being at quarterback. Vogelmann's numbers should skyrocket from the 12 receptions for 114 yards as a junior. He also had 10 total tackles, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a 38-yard pick six (vs. Sycamore).

Wyatt Pleasant, Sr, DL – One of the few returning lettermen on defense. Pleasant tallied 16 total tackles in eight games last fall.

Marvin Richter, Sr, RB – This should be a breakout season for Richter who is ready to explode onto the scene. He ran for 117 yards and a touchdown in three games as a junior.

NEWCOMERS

Jamison Kitna, Jr, QB – A big time talent, the transfer from Burleson (TX) will be one of the top quarterbacks in the state over the next two seasons. He threw for 2,600 yards, ran for 405 yards with 26 touchdowns passing and seven scores on the ground as a sophomore.

Ryder Hooks, So, RB – The transfer from Lebanon will add depth to the backfield.

Parker Elam, Jr, DE – The time has come for the 6-foot-5, 215-pound rush end to shine as he is thrust into a starting role.

Lakota East quarterback Jamison Kitna announces commitment to Houston

Quarterback Jamison “JT” Kitna comes to Lakota East from the Lone Star State as a pleasant and welcomed surprise package to go along with his dad an ex-NFL signal-caller, Jon, who was introduced as the new head coach of the Thunderhawks on Wednesday. JT immediately becomes one of Southwest Ohio’s and the Buckeye State’s top rated quarterback recruits in the class of 2025. He heads into his junior campaign with offers that already include Baylor, Duke, Houston, North Texas, Texas Tech, UAB and UTSA.

Built more like a linebacker at 6-foot-2 and 220-pounds and the potential to be a barrel-chested beast out of the backfield, Kitna is a punishing dual-threat at quarterback. He started last season, as a sophomore at Burlison (3-7), which is 15 miles south of Fort Worth and the Dallas metro area.

5 things to know as Kitna takes over at Lakota East

LIBERTY TOWNSHIP, Ohio – Jon Kitna smiled, looked out into a sea of reporters last Wednesday and joked.

"There's more press here than when I signed as a free agent with the Bengals," Kitna laughed.

Kitna, who spent five seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals from 2001-2005, was formally introduced as the next head football coach at Lakota East High School on Feb 22.

"It's surreal, to be honest. We left here in 2005. We have adopted boys who live here and their families. They graduated from (Lakota) East. Their wives graduated from (Lakota) East. We have seven grandkids that live in Ohio. Our best friends in the world live here," Kitna said. "It's exciting."

Here are five things to know as Kitna joins the Greater Miami Conference.

1. Kitna's coaching experiences include 4 high schools, NFL

One year after retiring from the NFL, Kitna took over as the head coach at Lincoln High School in Tacoma, Washington, his alma mater. Kitna coached at Lincoln for three seasons, going 24-8 with a state playoff berth.

Kitna also has high school head-coaching stops at Waxahachie High School in Texas (2015-2017), Brophy College Prep in Phoenix (2018) and was most recently the head coach at Burleson High School in Texas for three seasons. Kitna was also the quarterbacks coach for the Dallas Cowboys in 2019.

Overall, Kitna has a 69-38 combined record as a high school head coach. Will his winning ways continue in the GMC?

Kitna replaces Rick Haynes, who spent the last 13 seasons as head coach of the Thunderhawks and resigned earlier this month. Lakota East went .500 (48-48) against GMC foes during Haynes' 13-year tenure and 70-65 overall.

"We're gonna be a team that is tenacious, coachable and resilient," Kitna said. "We're a leadership factory. When you talk about high school football in

America, we believe it's a great opportunity to instill some of the characteristics and traits that you need to be successful in life."

2. Lakota East got their 'big fish'

Lakota East Principal Robert Burnside had coached Kitna's adopted sons for one year at Lakota East and made the first contact with Kitna just a few days after Haynes resigned. That's how the ball got rolling when the Thunderhawks were in the market for a new head coach.

"We thought this is our opportunity and let's see if we can go after a big fish and see if it works out," Lakota East Director of Athletics Jill Meiring said.

Kitna visited Lakota East and did a tour of the stadium and the fieldhouse and there was mutual interest, according to Meiring.

"I think we're both on the same page with the vision of the program. It's exciting for him," Meiring said.

What attracted Kitna to the job?

"It didn't take long to know God was doing something. He was opening a door that he was calling us to our season of life," Kitna said. "The football side was attractive, as well. Where (Robert) Burnside, Jill Meiring, see the program and what they want to do. It's gonna be a challenge but we're excited about it."

3. Inspiration down the road

Just eight miles south of Lakota East High School, Lakota West has turned into a football powerhouse just four years after hiring Tom Bolden.

In the four seasons prior to Bolden's arrival (2015-2018), Lakota West went 15-25. In last four years under Bolden, Lakota West has gone 39-8, with three consecutive GMC titles, a current 23-game league winning streak, a 9-4 playoff record and three-straight trips to the Division I, Region 4 championship game.

Lakota East has gone 19-20 in that span with one playoff victory. Last season, the Thunderhawks (3-7 overall) were seventh in the GMC, their worst finish since 2015.

"Obviously, Lakota West is one of our big rivals. They've done a phenomenal job of turning their football program around to state and national prominence," Meiring said. "We want to be on that same track. This was something that we knew had to be a really good hire."

4. A new offense on Lakota Lane?

Last season, Lakota East ran the ball on 83.4% of its offensive snaps. The Thunderhawks have not had a 900-yard passer since 2005 (Nick Darland) and have not eclipsed 1,000 yards passing as a team since 2010.

That could change with Kitna leading the program and his son, sophomore Jamison Kitna, under center.

Jamison, a 6-foot-2, 215-pound sophomore, already holds offers from Baylor, Duke, Houston, North Texas, Texas Tech, UAB and UTSA, according to his 247Sports profile. Last season, he threw for 1,896 yards and 15 touchdowns against seven interceptions along with

six rushing scores.

"Just a guy who tosses the ball around and uses my legs to hurt the defense. Just excitement, I guess," Jamison said of what Lakota East fans can expect. "I think physical growth is one thing, quickening my release, making more consistent decisions and being more accurate with the football (how he's improved the last two years)."

On expectations from the offense, Kitna said he's coached a variety of different styles and expects points, one way or another. Lakota East ranked ninth in the GMC in scoring (10.6 points per game) last season.

"I've run everything you can think of from the pro-style stuff. We're gonna do what suits the young men in this program and what they do best. Our job on offense is to put the ball in the endzone; don't really care how it gets there," Kitna said. "There's zero ego when it comes to that. As a staff, that's what we're trying to put together. It's a team thing."

5. Optimism from Kitna, Lakota East fanbase

Team turnarounds don't happen overnight, but the splash hire of Kitna resonated with a Lakota East fan base that hopes to ascend to the top tier of the GMC in the coming years.

"First it was shock, then it was excitement," Meiring said of the reaction to Kitna's hiring. "I think the kids are really going to buy in. He's got a son that's a quarterback. He was a quarterback. It's gonna be a little different style of Lakota East football. I think that's appealing to some people."

Kitna said he and the Lakota East administration are on the same page regarding the future of the program. He felt it during the interview process and last night when he watched the Lakota East boys basketball team beat Withrow in the second round of the sectional tournament.

"They want to be one of the best programs in the state of Ohio," Kitna said. "There's a commitment level to that. They have programs that have done that. There's an understanding as to what excellence looks like."

Ex-Bengals QB Kitna leads Lakota East into season

The Lakota East Thunderhawks went 3-7 in 2022. They were seventh in the Greater Miami Conference in total offense and total defense, getting outscored 224-106 on the season.

None of those numbers matter now that former Cincinnati Bengals quarterback Jon Kitna is the head coach.

"We don't spend a lot of time talking about last year. We don't spend a lot of time talking about other people," Kitna said.

In the five months since Kitna arrived at Lakota East, he has raised the expectations so the Thunderhawks not only return to winning football but the top half of the GMC.

How exactly are the expectations different? Every day, Kitna notices that this team possesses tenacity and resilience, the ability to forget the previous day's mistakes and come to practice ready to get after it. The Thunderhawks got off to a slow start in their Aug. 4 scrimmage against La Salle, but their resilience was on display as they bounced back in the second half.

"We've got a new saying: 'All you got, all the time.' It's kind of what we live by," senior wide receiver Andy Vogelman said.

Vogelman is one of 25 seniors on a roster that also lists 38 juniors. The ros-

ter has gotten old and stayed old, an attribute that will help the Thunderhawks find success both on and off the field.

As the top returning tackler from a defense where nine of the top 10 tacklers graduated, junior linebacker Cohen Reip had to adjust to a new system. Buying into Kitna's plan has helped him become a leader for the rest of the defense.

"With a new defense, I started from zero, too. But I just had to pay attention, focus, and lock in," Reip said.

Reip also mentions senior linebackers Hezekiah Holliman and Nathan Butturini as players who have stepped up in the preseason.

Quarterback Jamison Kitna is one name who will demand the opposition's attention from the Thunderhawks' roster. The University of Houston commit threw for 1,984 yards and 16 touchdowns as a sophomore at Burleson High School in Texas. For a Lakota East offense that hasn't surpassed 1,000 total passing yards since 2010, Kitna's arrival brings a vastly increased offensive presence.

"Teams are going to expect us to pass it a little bit more than we did last year," Jamison said.

The younger Kitna is excited his father will continue to coach but also that Jordan Kitna is on the staff, adding to the

team's family atmosphere. His integration into the team has been seamless, as evidenced by his joking demeanor with teammates and effortlessly slinging passes around the field during practice.

"I've had a lot of time to grow and connect with everyone," Jamison said. "You've got to make these connections, and especially as the quarterback, you've got to lead the team."

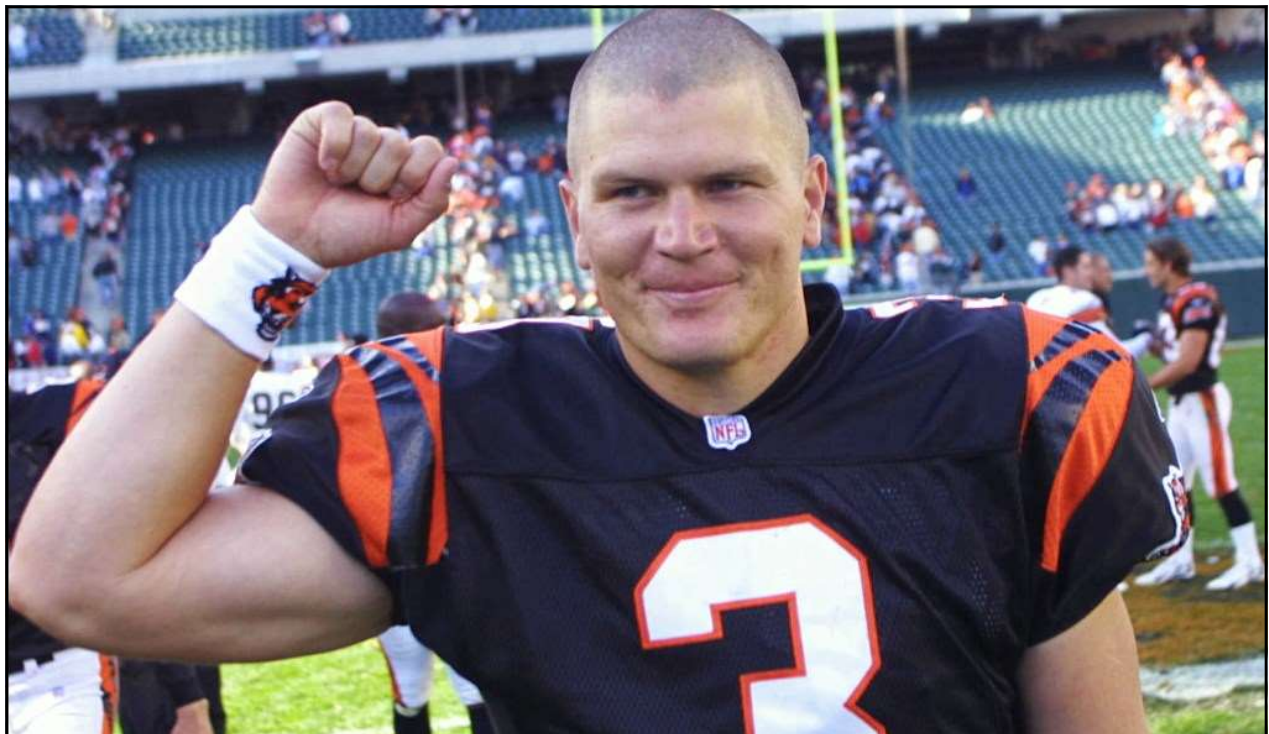
The elder Kitna has embraced the challenge that comes with a new school and team. Even before he took his first head coaching job at Lincoln High School in Tacoma, Washington, he learned from Steve Specht, Kerry Coombs and Tom Bolden in preparation for his future. He doesn't want to build a team based on the credibility of his last name, but rather the principles of the program.

"We're going to partner with the parents to try to build the character traits that we think help young men be successful," Jon said. "Lakota is a very talent-rich place."

Before any games are played, the computer assumes that the opponents on each school's schedule will play a full complement of games and assigns the divisor of 100 (10 weeks times 10 opponents = 100). After each week of the season, for each open date that occurs for an opponent that a school has played to date, the computer subtracts the divisor by one. In other words, if week five has just been completed and all five of a school's opponents have played a full complement of games, then the divisor remains at 100, and second level points are divided by 100. If one opponent on a school's schedule to date has had an open date, then the divisor reduces by one to 99, and second level points are divided by 99. If two opponents on a school's schedule to date have had an open date, then the divisor reduces by two to 98, and second level points are divided by 98, and so on. The second level points are then multiplied by the factor 10 in order to move the decimal point higher so that the averages are comparable to those in past years. First and second level point averages are then added together for an average total.
