The Centerville Elks open their 74th football season this Friday night. The **740th** game will be on the road at Lakota East stadium. The Thunderhawks are coming off a 7-4 season last year and were the 5th seed in region 4, (The Elks were the 5th seed in Region 2) of the 2021 OHSAA playoffs.

Twenty senior players return to lead their teammates after two weeks of two-a-day practices and two scrimmages. Brent Ullery enters his sixth season as the Head Coach and is very optimistic for another successful campaign. The players have worked extremely hard during the off season, preparing themselves physically for the challenge of Centerville football. For the first time in four years the Elks will have a new starting quarterback in junior Drake Wells.

The Elks return seven players who were recognized last year by their competitive coaches as they won GWOC honors. Nic Bruder, DB, Emmanuel Deng, DB, and Matt Karpinsky, LB represented the Elks on the defensive GWOC teams. Jackson Courville was first team All-Ohio as well as the top GWOC kicker in 2021. Emable Wakilongo, RB, Jackson Mires, OL, and James Owsley, OL offensive skills were spotlighted by the coaches on the offensive GWOC teams.

The Thunderhawks return three players who were All-Conference in the tough Greater Miami Conference last season. Offensive tackle, Austin Siereveld, 6-5, 315 lbs, and center Harrison Clute 6-3, 195 lead the offensive line. Running back Eric Davis was second team All-GMC returns and poses a challenge for the Elks. Another challenge for the Elks defensive line is Austin Siereveld, who has committed to Ohio State. He had narrowed his top three schools to Alabama, Notre Dame and the Buckeyes.

Chat with Coach Ullery



1. One of the best things to evolve in our football program is...

The expansive outreach of our program. Our kids are involved now, more than ever, with giving back to the community, helping the youth in our district, and getting involved in our school. We have more kids than ever taking AP classes, volunteering, and playing multiple sports. Additionally, our program has taken on teaching our players how to become better men, brothers, husbands, and fathers. Our focus on leadership through our core values of Humility, Effort, Attitude, Team, & Tradition have helped our players continue to grow, evolve, and mature. Our program is tradition-rich and we have a lot to be grateful for, but it's important to us that we honor those that came before us, showed us the way, and have afforded us the opportunities that we have. We are tremendously thankful for our alumni, previous coaches, and support. Our goal each day is to leave this place better than we found it.

2. <u>The biggest change I've seen in high school football through the year is...</u>

They respect hard work and they need to learn how to work hard themselves. It's hard to stay focused on it and stay centered, but it's paramount and it's something that I wish I was better at early in my career. 4. The best effort -individual or team- I've ever coached against was...

We face a lot of great teams, with great athletes, and great coaches. They play hard, they play smart, and they play together. If I had to pick the best effort I've ever coached against, I'd have to say Fairmont. The year doesn't matter. Dave Miller has done a phenomenal job over there and those kids flat-out get after you. They don't care about the score, or who they are playing against. They just go hard and expect you to rise to their level. I have a tremendous amount of respect for the effort they give at Fairmont.

Before any games are played, the computer assumes that the opponents on each school's schedule will play a full complement of games and assigns the divisor of 100 (10 weeks times 10 opponents = 100). After each week of the season, for each open date that occurs for an opponent that a school has played to date, the computer subtracts the divisor by one. In other words, if week five has just been completed and all five of a school's opponents have played a full complement of games, then the divisor remains at 100, and second level points are divided by 100. If one opponent on a school's schedule to date has had an open date, then the divisor reduces by one to 99, and second level points are divided by 99. If two opponents on a school's schedule to date have had an open date, then the divisor reduces by two to 98, and second level points are divided by 98, and so on. The second level points are then multiplied by the factor 10 in order to move the decimal point higher so that the averages are comparable to those in past years. First and second level point averages are then added together for an average total.


