The Centerville Elks defeated the Marysville Monarchs 42-21 in the second round of the OHSAA Division I Region 2 tournament last Friday night at Centerville Stadium. This is the farthest the Elks have advanced in the playoffs since 1991, when the Elks were state runners-up.

Records were meant to be broken, and Mike Nugent is proud of fellow Man of Centerville, Jackson Courville, who broke his 22 year record for the longest field goal. Mike set the record on October 27, 2000 against Wayne. (see page 20)

When asked what was going through his mind before the kick, Jackson focused on his technique. "I reminded myself to get through the ball, I was worried about getting it there." Following the successful field goal, Jackson had an incredible adrenaline rush that launched his next kickoff 70 yards that landed beyond the Marysville endzone. What an awesome display of kicking power and accuracy.

The Monarchs are a well-disciplined and very well coached football team. The game was a back and forth affair with seven lead changes up until the 2:21 mark in the third quarter. That is when the Elks exploded, putting up 25 unanswered points and taking a little over five minutes. Centerville scored multiple ways with one rushing touchdown, PAT by kick, the record breaking field goal, a passing touchdown, PAT pass and then a "Pick-Six" to end the scoring.

All three phases of the game: offense, defense and special teams, played very well, which is needed to continue to advance in the playoffs. It will take another solid effort this Friday night in another battle with GWOC Champion Springfield. The Wildcats made it to the state final last season, falling to Lakewood St. Edwards 13-23.

This fall, their goal is to break through the state semifinal barrier and win an OHSAA championship. The Elks have that same goal, and an upset victory over Springfield would be a nightmare for the Wildcats, and a dream come true for your Centerville Elks! **GO ELKS beat the Wildcats!**

Over the last five games the Elks offense has scored, on average, 77% of their points in the second half. What do you attribute that statistic to, coaches halftime adjustment, players focus, sense of urgency, or other factors?

You're right. We tend to score more in the 2nd half. Obviously we gameplan and our players know what to expect. We haven't really seen too much this year that we weren't ready for in our initial gameplan. However, it might just be that our players are feeling out the opponent. It seems like they get a little more confident each drive. Additionally, we struggle on drives that include a penalty. If we get behind schedule, it's almost a certainty that we will struggle on that drive. Our coaches do a phenomenal job at halftime. We haven't had any wholesale playbook changes at halftime yet this year, but each coach gets with their

position, hears their feedback, and helps them find ways to get the job done within our normal calls. One thing we have been doing really well at halftime is eliminating calls from the call sheet. Knowing that something will not work has been a big benefit for us.

Elk penalties have been steadily decreasing from a high of 16 for 165 yards in week 7 to last week's 5 penalties for 55 yards in the Marysville game. What has been the reason for this significant improvement?

Our players have done a great job this year at improving each day and being better than they were the day before. We met with the captains, and we also met with the coaches. We talked about the importance of being better in this area. Since then, our players have been much more disciplined. We are doing a much better job of eliminating the silly penalties. I don't know that I subscribe to the school of thought that there should be no penalties. We don't want to hold our players back from playing at full speed. We don't coach penalties but sometimes they happen. We have talked greatly about the difference between silly penalties and penalties that happen because we are playing aggressive. Pre-snap penalties and personal fouls are silly. Playing fast and aggressive and getting a penalty is part of the game and offers a great coaching opportunity between the players and coaches and officials.

Jackson Courville broke Mike Nugent's, 22 year old record for the longest field goal. You witnessed both kicks, what do you remember about Mike's 52 yard kick on October 27th, 2000?

I actually just had this conversation with Jackson the other day. I think we both have a tremendous amount of respect for Mike Nugent. He was a great player, he's a great ancestor to our program, and I would call him a great friend that's always been supportive. I told Jackson that the impressive thing about Mike's kick was that he played QB the entire game that night. He lead the drive down the field and ended it with a 52 yard kick. Mike and Jackson will both tell you, though, that those deep kicks are extremely hard no matter what you're doing before you make the kick. Both kicks were in huge games and both kicks were very impressive. Mike even went so far as to send Jackson a short video after the game congratulating him on breaking the record. Mike is a class-act and couldn't be happier that Jackson broke his record. Both men are great ancestors to the program and will be rooting for the next generation of kickers to push the envelope and break the new record.

Congratulations on your selection as Co-Coach of the Year for the GWOC. The Elks placed seven on the first team, (more than any other school), what is the selection process for the All-GWOC conference awards?

Thank you. Any coach will tell you that there's no such thing as a coach's award without great support and great players. The amount of players that we have on the All-GWOC team is really a tribute to the amount of work that these players and assistant coaches have put in. They attack each day with incredible Humility, Effort, Attitude, Team, and Tradition. They put in the work and they are seeing the fruits of their labors. Awards are never the goal for us but they are good to show our players and coaches that their hard work does not go unnoticed. We have a great team because of the great players and assistant coaches. They are honored to be recognized.

Centerville pulls away late, 'Boro loses a heartbreaker

Centerville broke the game open late, pulling away in a back and forth game for a 42-21 victory against Marysville in Friday night playoff football.

Trailing 24-21 late in the third quarter, the Elks scored 25 unanswered points to close the game.

Braylon Newcomb led the way for Centerville, finishing 10-of-15 through the air for 86 yards to go with 121 rushing vards and three touchdowns.

Nic Bruder tacked on a TD throw to Jamar Montgomery, who tallied five catches for 56 yards.

Other Elks highlights included Jackson Courville drilling a 55-yard field goal and Ross Coppock hauling in an interception return for a score.

The 55-yard field goal marks the longest in school history. Mike Nugent held the previous record at 52.

Centerville moves on in the Division I, Region 2 playoff to face a familiar foe next Friday in Springfield, which knocked off Fairmont 21-0 on Friday night.

Springfield won this year's regular season matchup with Centerville 38-10.

Springfield gets revenge against Fairmont

Wildcats record their third shutout of the season.


The Springfield Wildcats didn't dance in front of their marching band after their 35-7 victory in the first round of the playoffs. They didn't play well against Olentangy Orange despite the lopsided score, and coach Maurice Douglass let them know as they gathered around him after the game.

In the second round of the playoffs Friday, the Wildcats had their fun with the band. The players sprinted from the handshake line to the end zone and celebrated a 21-0 victory against Fairmont, the only team to beat them in the regular season, in the second round of the Division I, Region 2 playoffs in Springfield.

The same D.J. Khaled song that always plays after a Springfield victory accompanied the celebration.

"All I do is win, win, win, no matter what," the song

played, Douglass said, "Better. It was a better performance. They did a better job paying attention to detail. We showed them what we did against (Fairmont) in the years prior to this year." Springfield blanked Fair-

mont 17-0 in the 2021 regular season. This game was much more similar to that game than Fairmont's 24-21 victory at Springfield on Sept. 23. The Springfield defense let the Firebirds sniff the end zone once in the fourth quarter with the Wildcats leading 21-0.

Springfield outgained Fairmont 286-115. Fairmont averaged 4.3 yards per carry and 200.2 yards per game on the season but was limited to 2.4 yards per carry and 101 rushing yards in this game.

Linebacker Jaivian Norman led the defense with 14 tackles and 21/2 tackles for a loss

"The defense played phe-

nomenal," said quarterback Bryce Schondelmyer, who completed 14 of 19 passes for 173 yards. "On first down when you hold those guys to one or two yards or even negative yards, you're set because you know they're probably not going to pass." No. 2 seed Springfield (10-

1) will play No. 3 seed Centerville (10-2) in a regional semifinal at 7 p.m. next Friday at a neutral site that will be announced this weekend.

Centerville beat No. 11 seed Marysville 42-21.

Springfield won 38-10 at Centerville on Oct. 7. The Wildcats have won five straight games in the series. This will be the teams' first playoff meeting.

For the third straight week, Springfield broke open a close game in the third quarter. It turned a 7-0 halftime lead into a 21-0 lead after three quarters with Schondelmyer throwing a 40-yard touchdown pass to Daylen Bradley on the first drive of the quarter and lavvin Norman running six yards for a score on the second drive.

Springfield outscored Northmont 28-0 in the third quarter in a 55-21 victory in Week 10 and outscored Olentangy Orange 21-0 in the third quarter in the first round of the playoffs.

In the first half, Springfield's opening drive ended with a fumble inside the Fairmont 5-yard line. Fairmont ended Springfield's second drive with an interception by Karmron Payne and then got a stop on 4th-and-2 on Springfield's third drive.

Springfield finally got on the board with 24 seconds left in the half on a 19-yard

little drop in the middle of the field. The guy tried to rob it. I put it over the top, and (Brown) made a great play going up for it. It was perfect.

Springfield now has won six straight games since its loss to Fairmont. It outscored Springboro, Centerville, Miamisburg and Northmont 186-35 in the final four weeks of the regular season to clinch the Greater Western Ohio Conference title.

Fairmont, which beat Wayne 24-20 in the first round of the playoffs for its first home playoff victory in school history, end the season with an 8-4 record.



Wildcats blast Elks

CENTERVILLE — The Springfield football team has learned something about itself the last two weeks in blowout victories against Springboro and Centerville after losing 24-21 at home to Fairmont.

"We're gritty," running back Jayvin Norman said. "We hate losing. Our coaches hate losing. We got back in the lab."

"Sometimes it takes that," coach Maurice Douglass said. "You humble yourself and realize that you're not as good as you think you are, and you have to work to be special. In the last two weeks, we've done a really good job of paying attention to detail in practice. We've had really good spirited practices."

That led to a 54-14 victory at home in Week 7 against Springboro and a 38-10 victory at Centerville in Week 8 on Friday.

With two games to play, Springfield (6-1, 4-1) and Springboro (6-2, 4-1) share first place in the Greater Western Ohio Conference.

Springboro beat Northmont 41-17 on Friday. Wayne (5-3, 3-2) lost 26-21 at home to Fairmont to fall into a threeway tie for third with Centerville (6-2, 3-2) and Fairmont (6-2, 3-2).

Springfield closes the season with a home game against Miamisburg and a road game at Northmont. Springboro plays at home against Wayne in Week 9 and then plays at Miamisburg.

The Wildcats continue to dominate the series against

Centerville. This was their fifth straight victory against the Elks and second straight blowout. Both teams ranked in the top 10 in Division I a year ago when the Wildcats won 44-7 in Springfield.

This time Centerville ranked fourth and Springfield fifth in the state poll. However, the game was a rout from the start.

Springfield scored on its first two possessions. It took a 7-0 lead on a 13-yard run by Norman with 4:38 left in first quarter. Norman ran 49 yards for another touchdown with 21 seconds left in the first quarter, giving Springfield a 14-0 lead. Those were his third and fourth touchdowns of the season. He finished with 114 yards on eight carries.

"Nobody ever respects our

run game," Norman said. "They think we're a passing team. So I just came in prepared. We're young up front. We've got a bunch of sophomores and freshmen. We just do what we do."

Springfield has 10 rushing touchdowns and 23 receiving touchdowns in seven games.

Bryce Schondelmyer completed 19 of 30 passes for 345 yards against Centerville. He threw a 46-yard pass to Daylen Bradley to set up his own 3-yard touchdown run with 26 seconds remaining in the half. The Wildcats led 24-3 at halftime.

In the third quarter, Day-Day Owens ran three yards for a Springfield touchdown, and Schondelmyer threw an 80-yard touchdown pass to Anthony Brown.

Springfield outgained

Centerville 497-208. Centerville lost starting quarterback Drake Wells to an injury on Sept. 30. Braylon Newcomb and Gavin Monturo split time last week in a 37-6 victory against Beavercreek. Newcomb started this game and scored Centerville's only touchdown on a 51-yard run in the third quarter.

"We did a good job of taking away what we felt that they would try to do," Douglass said. "We know that (Newcomb) was a runner, and we let him get through there on one, and that was the biggest play all day but our guys did a good job of battling."

Sophomore QB leads Warriors over Elks

Wayne, Centerville, Xenia earn piece of WOL championship

CENTERVILLE — It's a question that is being asked all around Huber Heights this morning.

Where was Chase Riffle all season? The 6-foot, 195-pound sophomore quarterback for Wayne has emerged as a superstar the last two weeks and earned his

keep on Friday night, leading the Warriors to



a 20-17 upset of Centerville and perhaps a second-straight playoff berth.

A crowd of 9,700 watched Riffle pick apart the Centerville defense in the air and on the ground to help the Warriors claim a share of the final Western Ohio League title. Centerville (6-4 overall, 5-2 WOL), Wayne and Xenia all earned a piece of the league crown.

In just his second start of the

season, Riffle ran for 30 key yards and unofficially completed 19 of 36 passes for 303 yards, including 227 in the first half, as the Warriors (6-4, 5-2) built what seemed to be an insurmountable 17-0 halftime lead. He ran for a 9-yard touchdown and threw for a 9-yarder while keeping drives alive with his mobility.

"Chase was getting ready (on reserve)," Wayne coach Jay Minton said. "Chase had been doing a great job all year on the scout team."

When Wayne scored just three points against Fairmont a few weeks ago, Minton decided to make a QB switch. What a move. Last week, Riffle led Wayne to a win over Fairborn. Now this.

"(I was) making my reads, picking the right plays," an exhausted and emotional Riffle said.

Then when Centerville mounted a memorable fourth-quarter comeback that was culminated by **Mike Nugent's 52-yard** field goal, Riffle again took over, leading Wayne down the field late in the game. Jon McClain's 21-yard field goal with 1:12 left, which was made possible by a gutsy fake punt on fourth-and-two, sealed the deal.

"I knew we could pull it out," Riffle


said. "(Coach) just told me to keep my cool, settle down."

Centerville was its own worst enemy in the first half, aiding and abetting Wayne. The Elks fumbled deep inside Warrior territory once and missed several key blocks on short-yardage plays.

Riffle's first score, a 9-yard bootleg, gave Wayne a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter. Following a Centerville fumble, Riffle led the Wayne offense down the field to set up a 30-yard field goal by Jon McClain. Shortly before halftime, Riffle hooked up with Ryan Hodge on a 9-yard pass in the flat for a 17-0 intermission shocker. All of the scores were set up by key third-down conversions.

Centerville bounced back in the third quarter, scoring first on a 27yard halfback pass from A.J. Hawk to Evan Schulze. Then on the first play of Wayne's next possession, Chris Mitchell came up with a loose ball when Riffle was hit on the arm during a pass. Adam Newton ran it in from 13 yards on the next play to make it 17-14. Newton's long-range missile tied it but the Elks failed to capitalize on any other possessions.
