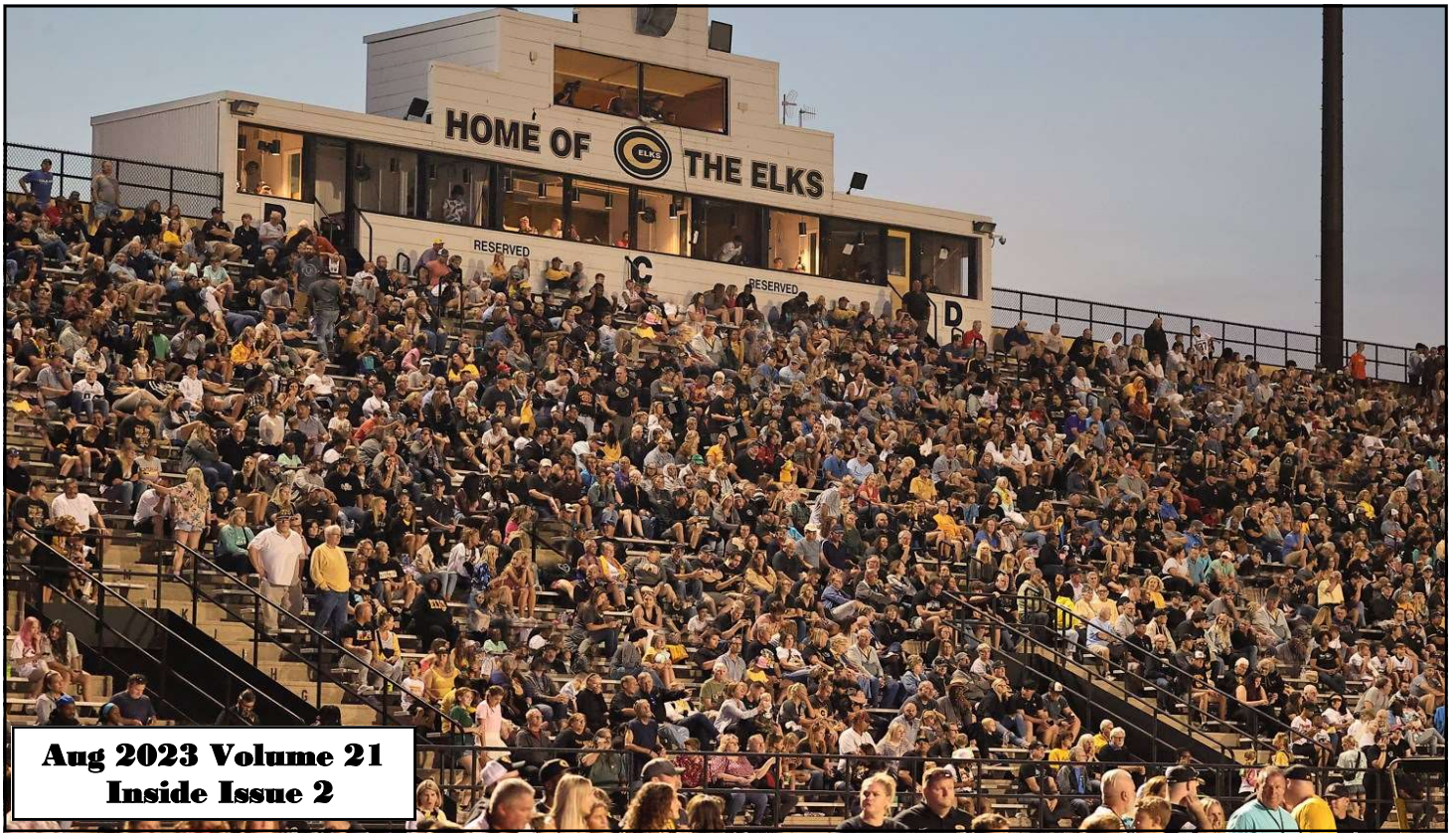

The Centerville Elks opened their **75th** football season with an impressive win over the Lakota East Thunderhawks 30-12. There were a number of firsts that made their debut in Centerville Stadium. The team wore their new “ELKS” black jerseys, (page 19). Senior Daniel Kamara, and Senior Soso Anosike, made their first starting assignments after transferring to Centerville High School. Lakota East Head Coach, Jon Kitna, was the first former NFL Quarterback to lead his team against the Elks. Elk Nation definitely turned out for Wee Elk / Middle School night in the beautiful refurbished Centerville Stadium.

Centerville scored 16 unanswered points in the second half to put the Thunderhawks away. Braylon Newcomb started the scoring early in the first quarter, however Lakota came right back quickly on a five play 80 yard drive. Then the Hawks scored again on a nine play 51 yard drive to take a 12-7 lead. The Elks stormed back on a Newcomb to Jamar Montgomery TD pass to take a 14-12 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Elks defense played an exceptional second half, shutting down the Thunderhawk's powerful passing game. The “Black Shirts” held Lakota to 39 yards in the air, and 33 on the ground for a total of 72 yards! The defensive staff, led by Defensive Coordinator, John Puckett, made the tactical adjustments that the players executed for the second half shutout.

LeLand Gantz, got on the scoreboard with a 36 yard field goal after replacing current Ball State kicker, Jackson Courville. Centerville's offense continued to the dominance in the second half by switching to a “ground and pound” running game. With Daniel Kamara, Parker Johnson, and Braylon Newcomb carrying the pigskin, they totaled 115 second half yards. The combination of an awesome defensive effort, steady special teams, and the ball control offense, were critical success factors for the season-opener victory.

This Friday, the Elks travel north to Columbus to face the always tough Dublin Coffman. The Shamrocks are also 1-0 after shutting out St. John's Jesuit 24-0 in Toledo, last week. Let's see how well Elk Nation travels to the first of only four road games this season. Hope to see many of you in the stands to watch our boys Rock the Rocks. **GO ELKS!**

What stood out to you, and the staff on the Elks performance Friday night?

Centerville turned in a dominant performance in the second half to walk away with a 30-12 opening night victory over Lakota East on Friday night.

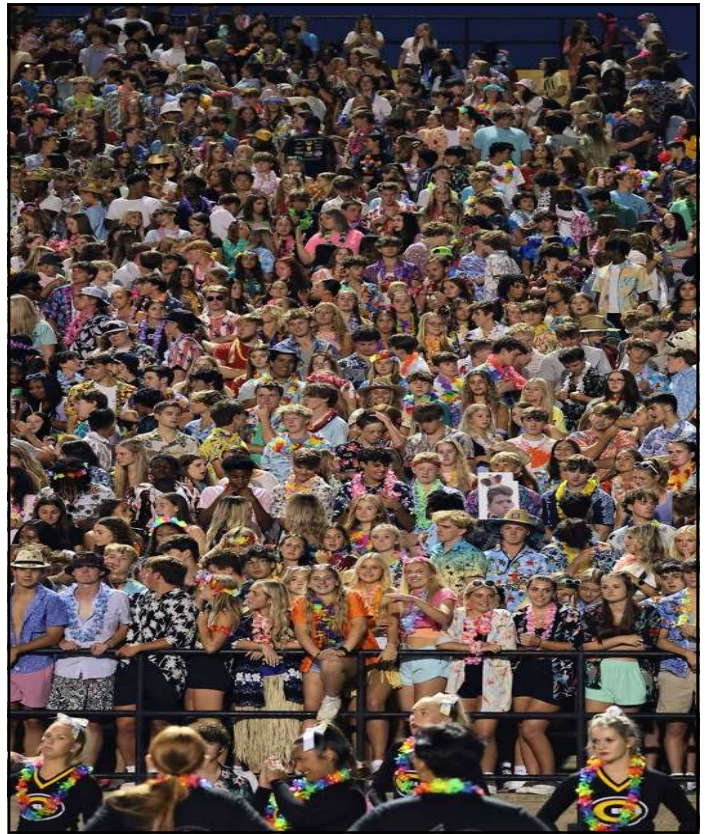
Braylon Newcomb accounted for three touchdowns, one passing and two rushing, to lead the way.

## Wayne wins 109-point shootout

Kickoff return proves to be game-winning play for Warriors.

HUBER HEIGHTS — The tradition of Wayne High School football is on full display inside the locker room at Heidkamp Stadium. Photos of Wayne greats from the past line a wall above one row of lockers. Banners list the team's playoff appearances and state runner-up finishes.

In decades of memorable teams and players, the program has experienced few, if any, victories like the one they earned Friday in the 2023 season opener. The featured 15 touchdowns and 970 total yards.

Coach Roosevelt Mukes addressed the team after a 58-51 victory against Fairfield on the turf at Heidkamp and summed up his feelings.

"Keep battling, stay together and great things happen," Mukes said. "I'm so proud of you."

Fairfield beat Wayne 41-24 in the season opener last season. This time, Wayne grabbed an early 21-0 lead that was but a distant memory as an avalanche of touchdowns began in the second half. After a defensive stop by Fairfield on the first possession of the half, the teams combined to score touchdowns on seven straight offensive possessions.

There had been seven scoring changes when Wayne freshman Jamier Averette-Brown took the kickoff 80 yards down the sideline in front of the Wayne bench for what would turn out to be the game-winning score with 8:01 to play.

"He saved us, man," Wayne

quarterback Tyrell Lewis said. "He blessed us."

Wayne's defense got its first stop of the second half on the ensuing possession. Then another freshman, Jaydon Heinrich, kicked a 28-yard field goal with 1:43 to play. The ball hit the top of the crossbar before skidding over. Those were the last of the game's 109 points.

Fairfield lost a fumble near midfield in the final minutes as Wayne clinched the victory.

"At the end of the day, it was just us saying together," Mukes said. "We talk to them all the time about how it's a team sport. Sometimes you've got to pick your brother up, and that's what they did. But first and foremost, I give honor to God. Without

him and these guys and coach (Jay) Minton, I wouldn't be in the position I'm in."

Mukes, a 1985 Wayne grad, succeeded Minton in 2019. The Warriors have finished 3-7, 5-3, 8-3 and 6-5 in his first four seasons.

Wayne hopes a memorable opener propels it to greater success this season. The play of Lewis should increase the optimism. He completed 20 of 28 passes for 372 yards with five touchdown passes. He also ran for two scores.

"That's the funnest game I've ever played," Lewis said, "and also my best game."

His top target was fellow junior Teaunn Hunter, who caught nine passes for 212 yards

and two touchdowns.

Fairfield quarterback Talon Fisher put on a show as well. He completed 15 of 22 passes for 245 yards and three touchdowns and rushed 24 times for 144 yards and three scores.

Fisher threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Noah King with 15 seconds left in the first half to cut Wayne's lead to 28-22. Then Fisher ran nine yards for a score on Fairfield's first drive of the second half to give the Indians their first lead.

"Our kids showed some resilience obviously and overcame some early adversity," Fairfield coach Jason Krause said. "We had two quick turnovers on the first two drives and were able to battle back to take the lead

a couple of times. It was back and forth. There at the end, we didn't make the plays to win the game, and they did. We scheduled this game for a reason. We want to play this game. We want to play good competition to get us ready for the stretch run in the conference."

Wayne plays at Pickerington Central in Week 2. The Warriors won the matchup 10-9 last season.

Fairfield plays its home opener against Sycamore next week. Fairfield won 41-0 last season.

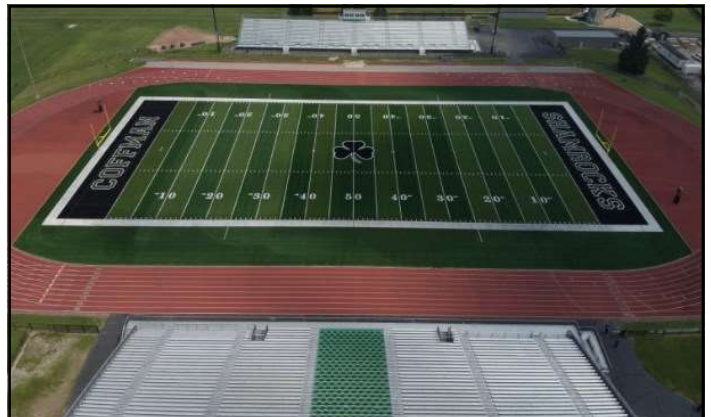
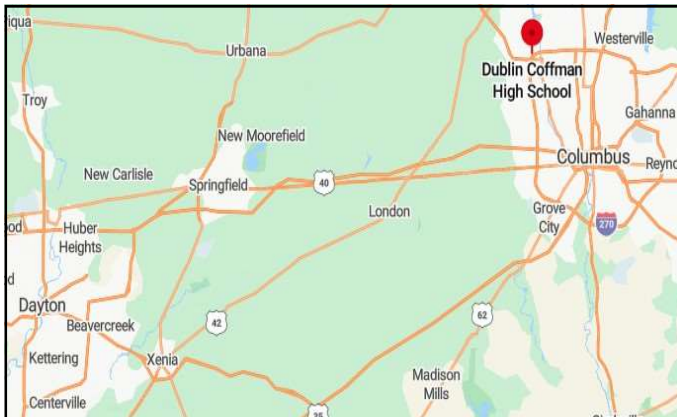

Hartley edged Big Walnut and Marysville beat New Albany on Friday, while Jerome topped Westerville South. There were two other changes in the Super 7. Gahanna Lincoln lost one first-place vote and is no longer a unanimous No. 1, and Pickerington North and Upper Arlington are no longer tied for third.

John helped Dublin Coffman go 7-4 last season. The Shamrocks posted a 4-1 conference record and lost in the first round of the OHSAA Region 2 tournament to Marysville. John finished his junior season with 52 tackles, 12 tackles for loss, 10 quarterback hurries, seven sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one touchdown.

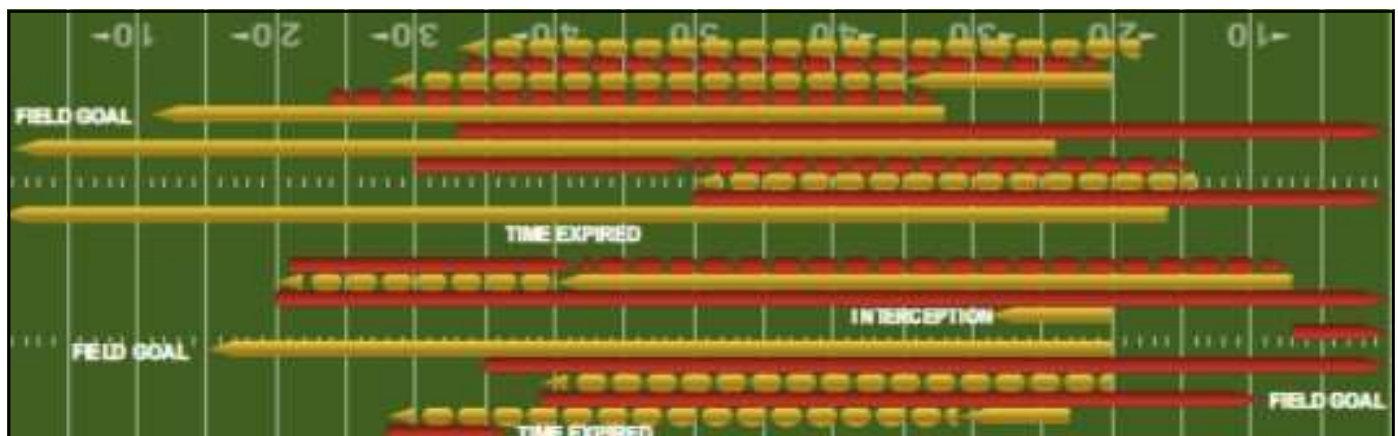

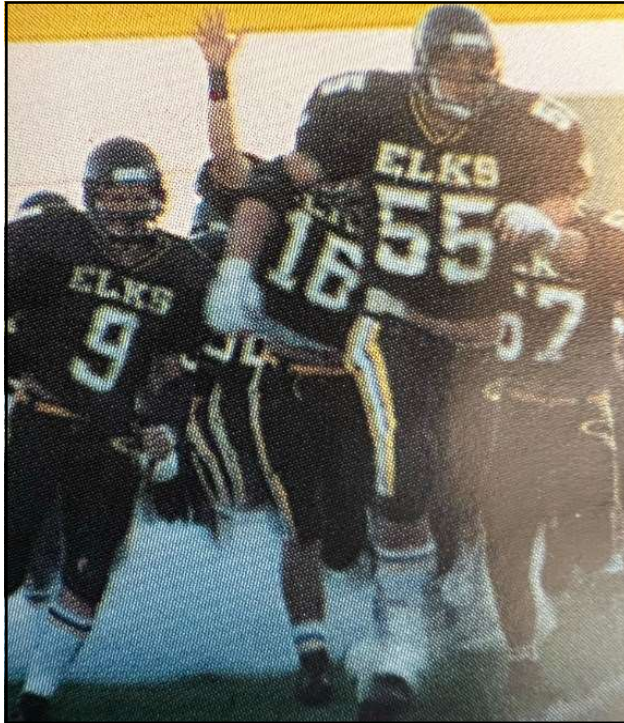

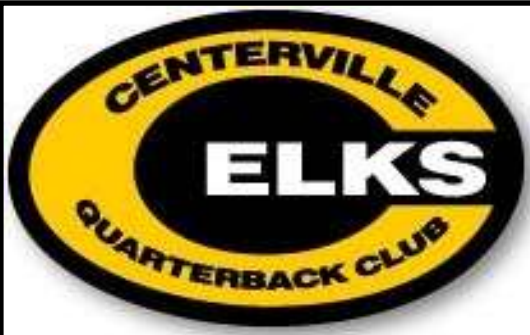
