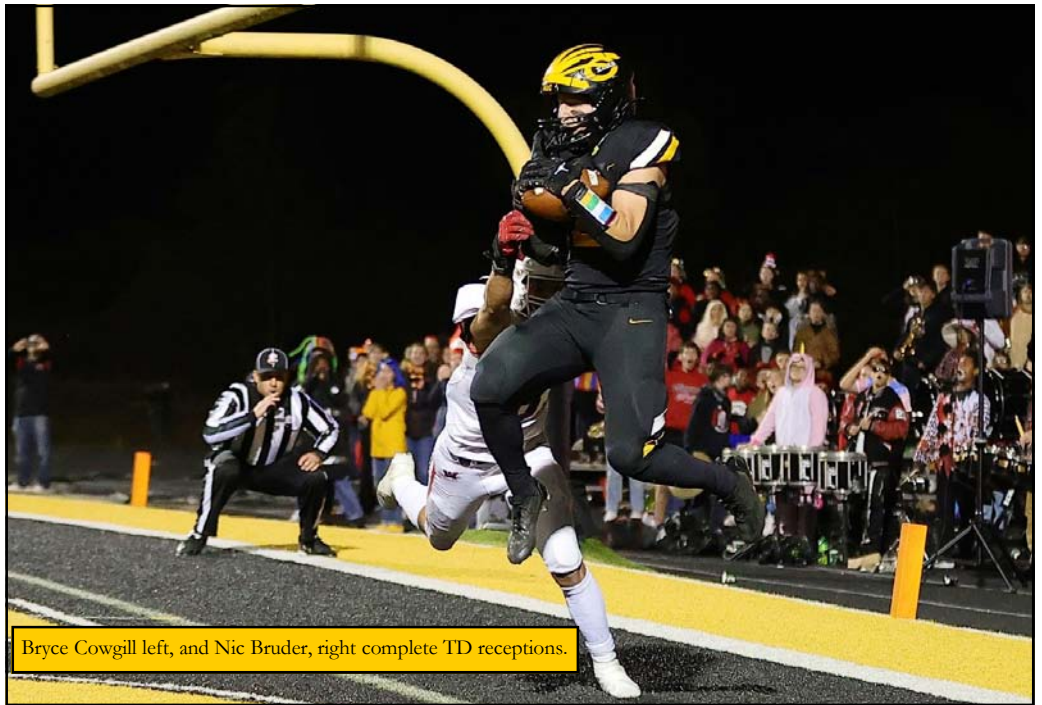

The Centerville Elks and the Wayne Warriors met for the 68th time in this tradition-rich rivalry last Friday. This was an instant classic with the game winning touchdown scored with 1.9 seconds left on the clock.

The first half was a back and forth, touchdown to touchdown battle, that definitely lived up to the rivalry anticipation. Jackson Courville put the Elks up 10-7 at halftime with a 49 yard field goal.

The Elks came out of the locker room fired up and stopped the Warriors on their 45 yard line. Nic Bruder fair caught the punt on the Elks 20 yard line. Centerville then went 80 yards on ten plays to extend their lead to 17-7. Then the Black Shirts delivered a "three and out," forcing Wayne to punt once again. The stage was set for the special teams to step up and block Wayne's punt and continue the Elk momentum. J.J. Jean-Louis was credited with the block that went out on the Warriors three yard line. Quarterback Braylon Newcomb took it in to the end zone on the first play with 4:10 minutes left in the third quarter.

After this score, and with a 17 point lead, many of the JV players were confident they would see some playing time. Wayne had something to say about that and was definitely not out of this game. They put on an offensive and special teams display of rapid scoring that has been common in this storied rivalry. The Warriors scored 4 touchdowns in the next 9:25 minute span. Although the Elks scored a touchdown in the middle of this Warrior attack, the final touchdown put Wayne up by six with 2:30 left to play.

What transpired next is something all boys dream about and play out in their backyards. First down and ten, needing a touchdown to win, quarterback, Braylon Newcomb, led the offense onto the field and took the snap on the Elks 34 yard line. "Yes, this was a dream that I have had and played out in my yard as well, said Braylon. "I was confident because I love my brothers, they had my back, and they knew I had their backs. We were prepared so well by the coaches that we just had to execute on the field and that is what we did, Nic beat his man and got him the ball, that's it."

Senior running back, Emable Wakilongo averaged 7 yards per carry as he out-rushed the Wayne backfield with 139 yards on 20 carries. He played an excellent game, and was voted a Player of the Week award for his effort.

Friday night it is STATE PLAYOFF time with the third seeded Centerville Elks facing the fourteenth seeded Northmont Thunderbolts for the second time this season. The next chapter in this growing rivalry will be written at a 7:00 kickoff at Centerville Stadium. It is a rematch where the Elks won the September 23rd Homecoming game 37- 6. The expanded format (16 teams vs. 8 teams) has opened the door for the 5-5 Thunderbolts, and they are looking forward to take full advantage of the invitation.

The Elks have been reminded repeatedly that they must guard against overconfidence, and the slip-ups that come with that. The coaching staff has shared many stories of higher-ranked seeded teams that make a quick exit because they didn't prepare to play their best. GO ELKS.. BEAT NORTHMONT!

# Inside the Headset



**Congratulations on the third seed, the highest seeding since 2017, your first season as head coach. What are some of the lesser known benefits of a home game in the tournament?**

One of the big benefits to having a home game in the tournament is that there is a familiarity on Friday night. Our guys are used to our stadium and they have the added benefit of having a great community behind them along with the best student section in the GWOC, The Herd. Also, not having to get on a bus Friday definitely eliminates a variable from our preparation. We have all of our facilities and all of the accommodations that we provide our players which will help.

**What did you see from your team during practice this week, and can an emotional rivalry win like last Friday, cause a letdown?**

We actually addressed that on Saturday with the team. Last week was emotional, intense, and awesome to be a part of. But it was last week. This is a new week and if we don't want this to be our last week together, then we need to prepare. The kids know this. We told them that they don't need to look at the next game, but rather, be intentional about the next rep at practice. Stay focused on having the best reps we can have, the best days we can have, and then hopefully we can play our best game this Friday.

**This game is a re-match from week five. What are the advantages and disadvantages of facing the same opponent in the playoffs?**

There are definitely some advantages and disadvantages in playing a re-match. We are familiar with them and they are also very familiar with us. When they graded their film from our first game, they probably saw some things to fix and they will make sure they are fixed. We hope that we are able to keep getting better as well. It's always tougher to beat someone again in the same season. Northmont has a very nice team and you can tell from their film that they have been coaching hard, watching film, and getting better each week.

**Do you and your staff spend time thinking what if Northmont does something differently that what we have seen or do you just work on what you have seen?**

We have a similar process for each team we play. Of course we analyze everything from this season. We try to figure out what they do the most, and what they do the best. Typically those are the same thing. That's where you have to spend the majority of your prep. After that, we look at what they do that can hurt us. For example, we look at how they attack a defense like ours to get ideas about how they will attack us. We have to have answers built in that are easy for our kids to adjust on the fly. You can't possibly try to plan for every single little thing, so ultimately, your prep has to be focused on yourself. We have to continue to get better each week and try to get better at the things that we do the most and that we do the best. The beauty of the gameplan is not in the drawings or assignments, but in the coaching and execution of the gameplan. That's where the difference is made.

## 'Let's go win': Centerville rallies to defeat Wayne on final snap

CENTERVILLE — Braylon Newcomb isn't the veteran pocket passer football fans think you need in a two-minute drive to win the game.

But all two-minute drives aren't created equal. And neither are quarterbacks.

On Friday night against rival Wayne, the Centerville sophomore — all 5 feet, 8 inches and 160 pounds of him — played the position for the final 2:30 like a poised veteran, scrambling and passing to convert two fourth downs.

At the end of the 66-yard drive and one of wildest nights in the schools' 68th meeting, Newcomb threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to senior Nic Bruder with nine-tenths of a second left to lift the Elks to a 38-35 victory on the final night and snap of the regular season.

"It is one of the best experiences of my life," Newcomb said. "I was just thinking, 'let's go win. There ain't no reason to be scared.' I love my brothers. I knew they had my back and I had theirs, so we did it."

The Elks snapped the ball with 7.8 seconds left and Newcomb moved around the backfield, like he did the entire drive, looking for a receiver against eight Wayne defenders. He saw Bruder break open in the back of the end zone, and Bruder, who makes big plays every game on offense, defense and as a kick returner, jumped and caught the pass.

"We do a two-minute drill every Thursday against our defense, and I just knew that we had the offensive linemen to be able to hold up, all our wide receivers were in there doing a great job and I just

happened to be open on the last play," Bruder said. "Braylon threw a great ball."

Newcomb, who passed for 129 yards and rushed for 31, started his third game Friday after replacing an injured Drake Wells in Week 7 against Beaver Creek. Wells and Chase Harrison before him are more known for their passing than Newcomb. But he made a completion on fourth-and-5 to start the drive and scrambled for a first down on fourth-and-1 to set up the winning score.

"He's just a great athlete all around," Bruder said. "I know he's going to make a play whenever he can. Never nervous, never wavers at all. He's just a great player."

Centerville (8-2, 5-2 GWOC) maintained the No. 3 seed in Division I, Region 2 according to joeitel.com and hosts a playoff game Friday against Northmont, a team the Elks beat 37-6 on Sept. 16. Wayne (6-4, 4-3) entered the night in seventh place in the region and dropped to 10th and will play at No. 7 Fairmont (7-3) on Friday. The Warriors lost to Fairmont 26-21 on Oct. 7.

The playoff pairings are made official today.

Elks coach Brent Ullery trusted Newcomb's play-making ability.

"We know that he makes plays somehow and he makes plays sometimes with his arm, sometimes it's with his feet," Ullery said. "He finds a way to get it done usually, so we knew just put all of our best players on the field and get after it."

Ullery also liked the way Newcomb managed the clock with one timeout and was willing to scramble when necessary and throw when necessary.

"It was very impressive to see a sophomore, relatively new quarterback, go out there and execute at that level," Ullery said.

Bruder, who intercepted his third pass during the first half, gave Newcomb a head start on the final drive with a 12-yard punt return.

"Bruder is the gift that keeps giving," Ullery said. "He finds a way to make plays. He's tougher than nails, as sharp as a knife. He's our team captain for his leadership rea-

sons, but he also is a leader on the field because he makes plays. We can rely on him."

The Elks increased their edge in the series to 35-32-1 by surviving a roller-coaster second half. They led 10-7 at halftime and 24-7 with 4:10 left in the third quarter after two quick touchdowns, a 2-yard pass from Newcomb to Bryce Cowgill and a Newcomb 3-yard run after a blocked punt. Emable Wakilongo kept drives going and rushed for 139 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries.

But Wayne came back in a wild second half to take a 35-31 lead with 6:45 left when Josh Williams blocked a punt, picked up the bouncing ball and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. About three minutes later, the Elks made a stop on third-and-7 to get the ball back for the last drive.

"I thought that was the most impressive attack of the adversity of the night," Ullery said.

"It's surreal, it's a movie," Bruder said of the Senior Night win and how it occurred. "Our brotherhood here is unbreakable."

## Elks, T-Bolts brace for Round 2

Having played in Week 3 this season, Centerville and Northmont are familiar with each other's football teams. But preparing for a playoff rematch is different.

"It's kind of odd," Northmont coach Lance Schneider said. "I've never actually had to do that before, even when I was an assistant — trying to prepare for a team you've already played. It adds to the intrigue, I guess."

Northmont (8-2) plays Centerville (9-1) at 7 p.m. Saturday at Centerville Stadium in a Division I, Region 4 quarterfinal.

The Elks forced several turnovers, got ahead and stuffed Northmont's offense en route to a 20-7 victory in Clayton. Now, the teams have seen each other on the field and will make adjustments.

"We've never done that either, at least not that I remember" Centerville coach Ron Ullery said of a playoff rematch. "I think too

much is made out of that. It's the same for both teams. You're more prepared because you know their personnel and systems.

"Does it give one team an advantage over the other? People say it's tougher to beat a team the second time than the first. I thought it was pretty tough to beat them the first time."

With Centerville, Wayne and Northmont making the playoffs, this season marks the first time three Dayton teams made the Region 4 playoffs.

It's also the first time two teams (Wayne plays host to Moeller) that two Dayton clubs have home-field advantage.

"That's great, it's kind of what was envisioned for the (Greater Western Ohio Conference), when

we put it together," Schneider said, "that it would get more teams in the playoffs."

The Elks pressured Northmont quarterback Clay Belton and the other Thunderbolts into turnovers. Centerville took advantage, using its option running attack to drive the short field for scores. Only a Kurt Coleman kick-off return kept Northmont from being shut out.

So, does that experience against the Elks' defense help the Thunderbolts prepare?

"If we did the exact same things, sure it would," Ullery said. "I don't think we're going to do the same thing. We're two very different teams but I think we're two pretty equal teams."

## Centerville wins 35-33 thriller over T-Bolts

*Elks rally from 20-7 halftime deficit, survive late scores*

**CENTERVILLE** — All the Elks raised their hands in victory Saturday night after an amazing comeback and heart-pumping finish. The packed Centerville Stadium crowd saw four scores in the

final 3:43, two by Centerville and two by Northmont.

Despite leading by nine points with 1:36 left, the Elks didn't clinch their 35-33 win until the final two seconds when Northmont quarterback Clay Belton spiked the ball on fourth down after a short completion.

"It feels amazing," Centerville defensive lineman Brad Hull said. "It feels like you're on top of the world."

The Elks (10-1) defeated Northmont in a rematch of a 20-7 win in Clayton. Now Centerville

will get a rematch against Wayne (10-1) next Saturday at Cincinnati's Paul Brown Stadium in the Division I, Region 4 semifinals.

"Nobody gave us this win," Centerville coach Ron Ullery said. "No fumbles lost by Northmont, no interceptions by Northmont so, by God, the second game, nobody's saying that they gave it to us."

The difference could have been two raised hands earlier in the game. Northmont (8-3) scored on its first three possessions, but Cole Sillaman blocked one Thun-

derbolts extra-point attempt.

"(Simon) Abboud pushed out his guy," Sillaman said. "I had no problem getting through a big hole. It was just a matter of getting back there and getting my hands up."

Trailing 20-7 at half, Sillaman's block may not have mattered. But the Elks started the third quarter with a 17-play, 66-yard drive that took 7:15. Elks quarterback Dan Drake scored on a 4-yard run to make it 20-14. The drive included two fourth-down conversions.

"You've got to take your hat

off to them," Northmont coach Lance Schneider said. "They made a drive to start the second half that they had to make. If they didn't, it might have been game over."

After a stop, Centerville's Tony Folino went 80 yards on first down for a TD and a 21-20 lead.

The Elks played without quarterback Ben Hemenway. But Chaminade-Julienne transfer Will Johnson — ineligible until this week — ran for 103 yards and a score.

When James Cravens (111

yards, two TDs) scored with 3:43 left, Centerville led 28-26.

But Belton (22-of-38 for 289 yards and four TDs) got hot, and A.J. Combest scored on a 44-yard run. That's when Hull batted down a 2-point conversion pass.

After Cravens' second score, Northmont scored in 19 seconds and got the onside kick but couldn't get a first down.

"I feel for these kids," Schneider said. "They played their hearts out. We just ran out of time."

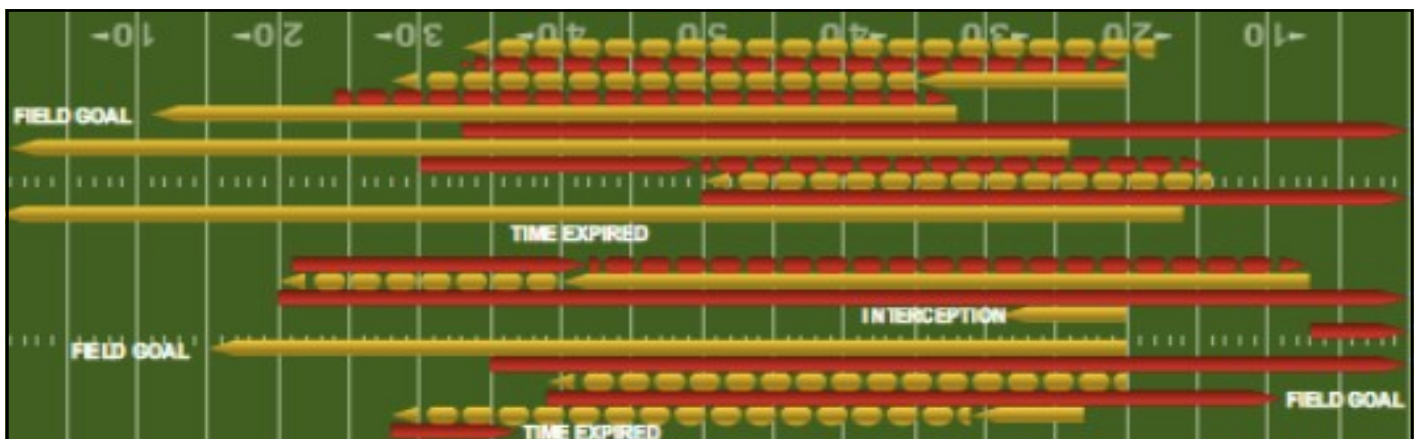

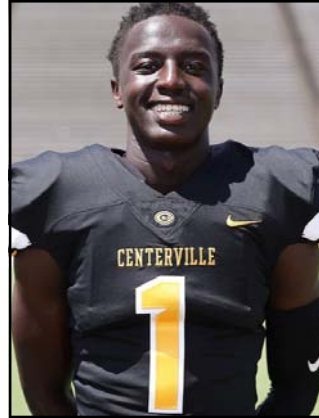

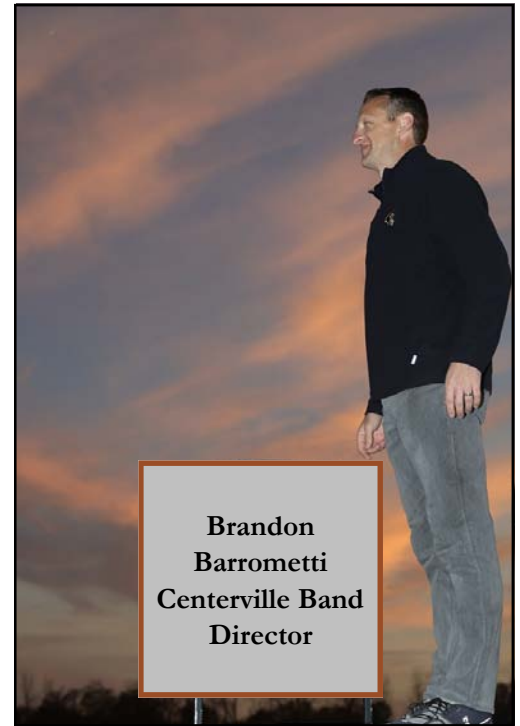
# 2022 Jazz Band

## 'It's just a blast being out there'

DePauw has been bringing the defense this season.

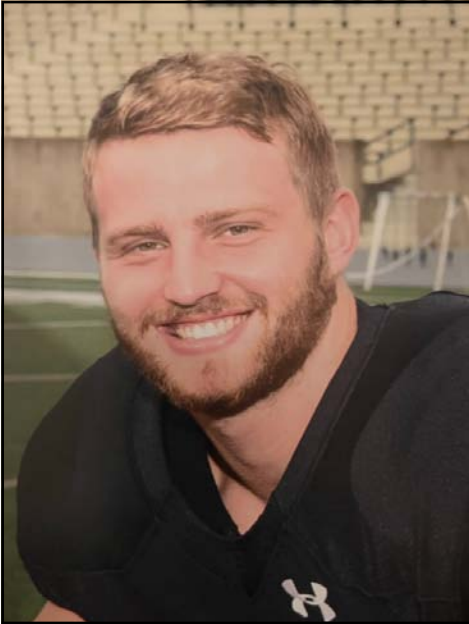
After giving up a pair of touchdowns in a 17-14 win over Rose-Hulman to open the season, the Tigers have pitched three straight shutouts – 55-0 over Anderson, 44-0 over Hiram and 59-0 over Wooster.

"We're having so much fun," DePauw junior linebacker Brevon Gude said. "Team chemistry has never been better, especially on defense. It's just a blast being out there."

DePauw has been blasting opponents, especially in the run game. Foes are averaging just 48.5 yards rushing per contest. It's not like teams are passing all over the Tigers, either. They are allowing 148.5 yards per game through the air.

That DePauw is off to a 4-0 start is no surprise. The Tigers are the defending NCAC champs and were picked to repeat in the preseason poll as well. They don't mind the pressure that comes with it.

"We love it. We were told in training camp that there's a target on our back. Being the returning champs and preseason No. 1, everyone wants to beat us," DePauw sophomore Jonathan Bruder said. "We have to continue to get better. We have to know going into every game we'll get the other team's best effort. That's been a huge driving force for us."

After winning the NCAC title with an 8-1 mark last year, DePauw won its first playoff game (26-21 over Rose-Hulman), but saw its season come to an end with a 45-0 setback to UW-Whitewater in the second round. The Tigers hope to build on that run.

The defense has benefited from practicing against its high-powered offense, which is averaging 43.8 points per game.

"It starts up front. As a linebacker, going against our o-line and getting great looks on all different styles of offense is important," Bruder added. "They do a great job. It's great being able to play against the talented guys we have. It's the iron sharpens iron aspect of it, which benefits both of us."

DePauw has had a chance to develop its depth on defense, too, thanks to some lopsided scores. There has been no drop-off with the different guys who have come into the lineup.

"It's a blast being able to post all these shutouts, especially when we are able to get some of the second-team guys into games," Bruder said. "Seeing those guys get in and excel is great. It's just as important for us to have a shutout as it is for them. It's an exciting feeling – whoever is in, we're all going for the same goal of a shutout."

"We have a lot of young talent on and off the field, guys that are pushing us to be great. There's a lot of competition," he continued. "Whoever we put out there plays to the best of their ability. Everybody is studying film and knows what they're doing, no matter when they get in. It doesn't matter who we put in there, they will play at a high level."

Despite the strong start, the Tigers know they have some things to fix.

"Effort has never been a problem for us. For some teams, it can be, but not for us," Bruder said. "The minor things can be fixed. You can't teach effort."

That's important for the squad as it begins the key stretch of its NCAC schedule. DePauw visits Denison this week and plays Wittenberg the following week. The Tigers trek to Ohio Wesleyan and Kenyon before closing the regular season at home against Oberlin and Wabash in the annual Monon Bell Game.

"Our guys are, of course, very excited knowing what's at stake," Bruder said. "We take every game as seriously as we can and the most important game is our next game. That gets us all on the same page. We can't have any hiccups. For this week, it's all about beating Denison and doing everything we can to make that happen. We can't look past that. That brings a lot of energy to our guys."

"We have a lot of fire and unity as a group. We just have to trust the guys around us will do their jobs and we can focus in one thing and not try to do too much."

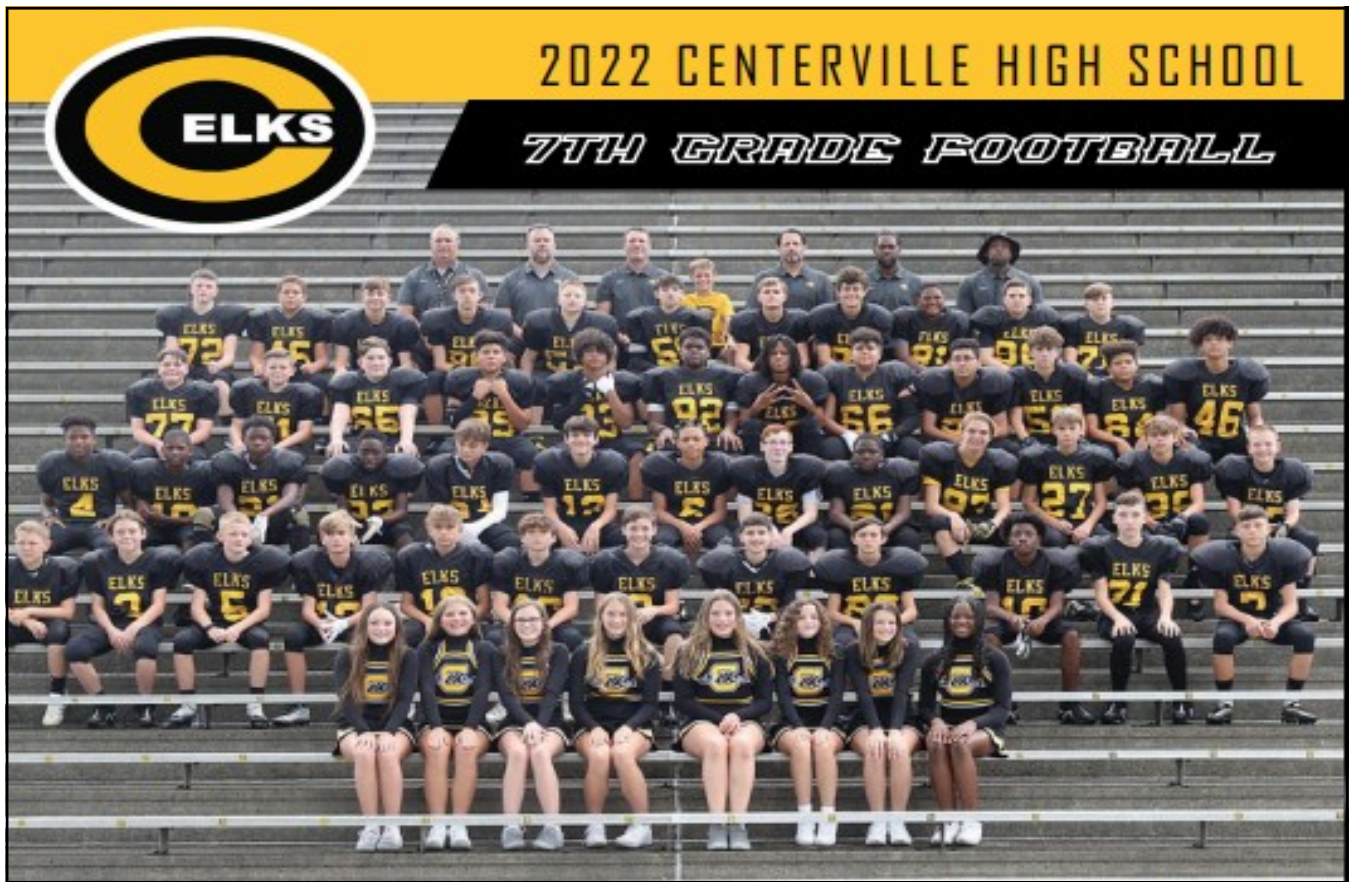

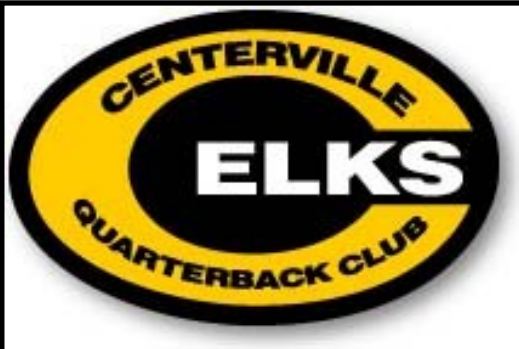
